OUTSTANDING PROPERTY TAXES AND UTILITIES

All outstanding 2018 property taxes and utilities are due by **December 31, 2018**. Outstanding utilities as of January 1, 2019 will be transferred to property taxes in arrears and accrue daily interest.

The Village Office will be closed December 24, 2018 and will reopen January 2, 2019. For your convenience, we accept post-dated cheques to December 31, 2018. Payments may also be made through online banking, <u>but please allow three days for your payment to be completed by your financial institution</u>. If you are not able to visit the Village Office in person, cheques may be placed through the front entrance mail slot. A final year-end deposit will be made on December 31.

To avoid interest, all payments must reach the Village Office by December 31, including those sent by mail and made through online banking.

SNOW REMOVAL

It's that time of year again for snow reminders:

- Residents are reminded that all vehicles must be removed from boulevards and offstreet parking must be provided for your visitors so vehicles do not impede the snow removal process. Vehicles restricting snow removal will be towed at the owner's expense. Warnings will not be issued.
- If you move snow from private property onto any street or sidewalk, you will be invoiced by the Village for time spent clearing the snow.
- Please **do not place plastic or tarps on the boulevard**, this is dangerous for our crew and damages equipment if the plow catches it.
- Please be aware that the Public Works Department maintains only the portion of Bluebird Road from Highway 3B to Scout Road. The remainder of Bluebird Road is maintained by YRB. Residents may notice that all of Bluebird Road may not be plowed at the same time.
- RDKB Area A residents please note that YRB is in charge of maintaining your roads. If there is a problem with snow removal, please contact YRB 1-888-630-1420 or the Ministry of Transportation in Nelson at 250-354-6400.

CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

The Village of Fruitvale will once again be taking Christmas trees to the landfill free of charge after the Christmas season.

Please bring your tree to the designated area (look for the sign) in the Pole Yard before **January 13, 2019.** There will be no curb-side tree collection. Please ensure all decorations and plastic tree bags have been removed when you drop off your tree.

2019 DOG TAGS (licenses)

The 2019 dog tags (licenses) will be available for purchase beginning on January 2, 2019. All dogs in the Village are required to be licensed. Cost for a license is \$25.00 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$75.00 for an unaltered dog. A current year tag on your dog will ensure that it is returned to you if it is found out of your yard. It's a small price to pay for the safe return of your family pet.

Please remember that it is a contravention of the Dog Tax and Regulation Bylaw No. 728 to allow your dogs to run free. Dogs at large run the risk of being picked up by the SPCA and fines will be levied to the dog owner. **Please, for the safety of everyone, ensure your dog(s) are secure in your house or yard.**

Dog owners are reminded to pick up their dog feces and to not let their dog bark continually while out in the yard. We have received numerous complaints of dog feces being left along sidewalks, roads and in alleyways and dogs continually barking at all hours of the day and night. Please be considerate of your neighbours – pick up after your dog, dispose of the feces accordingly and don't let your dog disturb the peace of the neighbourhood by continuous barking.



Don't forget to visit our local businesses for in-store specials and pick-up your baking ingredients or Christmas dinner fixins' at Liberty Foods.



IMPROVEMENTS TO CAMP TWEEDSMUIR SCOUTS CANADA FACILITY IN FRUITVALE, BC

Camp Tweedsmuir has been around since the first 10 acres were donated in 1933. over time we expanded to cover 40 acres, and all in the heart of the Village of Fruitvale.

For many past years we have been graced with funding from Columbia Basin Trust, allowing us to do needed repairs and make some awesome improvements to the facility. The youth and leaders have been so excited about all that we have accomplished.

This year is no exception — with the funding in place our volunteers got right to work. Our first project was to shore up the First Aid Cabin. It has been sitting on old sections of log for many years and these were rotting out. Our volunteers jacked up the corners, poured cement posts and then put the cabin back down. We then installed actual windows and siding to the whole building and trimmed up the windows and doors. It's now ready for a new coat of paint in the spring.

Our second project was to install a solar grid tie-in system. James York of District Solar Energy was very helpful in figuring out what we needed and then installing the 16 panels and all the connections needed. We have a display panel in the main hall so we can keep checking on how well we are doing at producing electricity. This has a second job — it is also there so we can teach the youth all about what is happening.

After all, it was the youth who said we need to do a better job at "going green."

Since the system has been running, we have had a positive outcome: we are using less electricity from FortisBC and saving on energy costs. Bonus for us!

Our last project, completed on Nov. 13, was the cover on the bridge. Our hard-span bridge was put in by the military back in 2007 (CBT funds!). Over the years, we have had to replace the deck and other small repairs plus tried to clear the snow off it during the winter, sometimes not successfully due to ice buildup. Now we have a nice cover over it that will make it



safe to use in the winter and will help to prevent time consuming maintenance.

All the work at the camp has been done by our volunteers to date other than the electrical projects. We can't thank Columbia Basin Trust and the local Communities enough. Without your grant program, we would not only have been unable to do these improvements, we would have been unable to keep up with the maintenance required.

Now to start planning for next year!!!
