SNOW REMOVAL

It's that time of year again for snow reminders:

- Residents are reminded that all vehicles must be removed from boulevards and off-street parking must be provided for your visitors so vehicles do not impede the snow removal process. Vehicles restricting snow removal will be towed at the owner's expense. Warnings will not be issued.
- If you move snow from private property onto any street or sidewalk, you will be invoiced by the Village for time spent clearing the snow.
- Please be aware that the Public Works Department maintains only the portion of Bluebird Road from Highway 3B to Scout Road. The remainder of Bluebird Road is maintained by YRB. Residents may notice that all of Bluebird Road may not be plowed at the same time.
- RDKB Area A residents please note that YRB oversees the maintenance of your roads. If there is a problem with snow removal, please contact YRB at 1-888-630-1420 or the Ministry of Transportation in Nelson at 250-354-6400.

Safety Notes:

- Please keep children safe and do not allow them to play on snow banks next to roads or on windrows in the middle of streets.
- Trucks and plows frequently slow down, turn and back up please stay well back from trucks and plows at all times for the safety of both you and the snow plowing crew.

2020 DOG TAGS (licenses)

The 2020 dog tags (licenses) are available for purchase. All dogs in the Village are required to be licensed. Cost for a license is \$25.00 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$75.00 for an unaltered dog. A current year tag on your dog will ensure that it is returned to you if it is found out of your yard. It's a small price to pay for the safe return of your family pet.

Please remember that it is a contravention of the Dog Tax and Regulation Bylaw No. 728 to allow your dogs to run free. Dogs at large run the risk of being picked up by the SPCA and fines will be levied to the dog owner. **Please, for the safety of everyone, ensure your dog(s) are secure in your house or yard.**

Over the past year, the Village Office received numerous complaints on dogs continually barking at all hours of the day and night and of dog feces being left along sidewalks, roads and in alleyways. **These are bylaw violations, not to mention inconsiderate to your neighbours.** Please, do not let your dog disturb the peace of the neighbourhood by allowing it to continually bark while it's out in your yard, pick up after your dog and dispose of the feces accordingly. **OUTSTANDING PROPERTY TAXES AND UTILITIES**

As of January 1, 2020, all outstanding taxes and utilities will be transferred to property taxes in arrears and begin accruing daily interest. **To avoid extra charges, outstanding property taxes and utilities must be paid by December 31**. The Village Office is closed from December 24 at Noon and will reopen January 6, therefore post-dated cheques to December 31, 2019 can be placed in the mail slot at the Village Office and on-line banking payments must be received by December 31, 2019.

THE GYM

Just a reminder about the pilot program for the age friendly GYM.

Beginning January 2020, the GYM will be opened to include non-senior (ages 20-49) residents of Fruitvale, Montrose and RDKB Area 'A' for a 6-month trial period (January to June 2020) and monthly user fees will be implemented for both senior and non-senior users.

All users are required to complete a new Release of Liability waiver form, available at the Village of Fruitvale office, and pay the appropriate fees: \$25 for a new security access card and the monthly user fee of \$30 for a non-senior user or \$15 for a senior user.

Seniors who currently possess an access card will not be charged the access card fee, however you <u>must complete a new Release of Liability waiver form and pay</u> the monthly user fee for your access card to be activated.

As of **January 2**, all security access cards will be deactivated and only those users who have paid the monthly user fee will have access to the gym. If you have lost your access card, there is a replacement fee of \$25.

GYM hours are:

For Seniors aged 50+: 5:00am-10:00pm / 7 days per week

For Non-Seniors aged 20-49: 1:00–3:00pm and 6:30-8:30pm / 7 days per week

If there are any seniors who have security access cards but do not use the GYM, please return the cards to the Village Office.

RDKB AREA 'A' ROAD MAINTENANCE

Area 'A' residents are reminded that snow removal and road maintenance is done by private contractors who are hired by the Province. These contractors, YRB – Yellowhead Road and Bridge, are responsible for maintaining provincial roads and highways year-round. They repair and maintain the driving surface (such as asphalt and gravel), the roadside upkeep in addition to handling bridge and winter maintenance. The contractor must meet obligations outlined in the service agreements in order to protect public safety. **If you have concerns with road safety,** please call 1-888 630-1420 (24/7) to speak to Yellowhead Road and Bridge, the contractor responsible for this service, or the Ministry of Transportation, 250-354-6400.
