MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Spring continues to be busy for the Village. In May, Council approved a budget for the coming year. Our significant budget challenge was raising enough funds to cover increasing costs from various items such as fuel and new employer premiums for BC Medical while keeping taxation increases as low as possible. This is a trying time for council as we are sensitive that there are many within our community that can ill afford tax increases.

You may have heard that our Anglican/United Church is closing effective the end of June. Council is trying to help find a solution for the many groups that use the church as a meeting space. One of the key user groups is the Beaver Valley Food Bank. The volunteers work hard to provide monthly food hampers to upwards of 40 homes in the Valley. We are optimistic that a solution can be found to house all the displaced groups. On May 21, Council joined with other BC Municipalities to plant a maple tree in Railway Park as part of Local Government Awareness Week to recognize and thank our Fruitvale Municipal staff for the work they do for us all.

I'd like to take this opportunity to give a big Fruitvale welcome to four new businesses in town: Ruala Café, located in front of Lordco Parts at the west entrance to town, where they offer a variety of food and drinks in a beautiful artistic atmosphere; Isabella's Cantina, located in the freshly renovated restaurant of the Villager's Inn, with delicious authentic Mexican food; Rossland Collision - Fruitvale, owned by Fruitvale born & raised Brian Deadmarsh, located in the former Kootenay Autobody and Collision building; and Beaver Street House, an Air B and B located on the corner of Beaver Street and Kootenay Avenue. We are so happy to have these new businesses in town and wish them the best of luck in their new ventures. Thank you for choosing Fruitvale. PROPERTY TAXES

Property tax notices have been mailed out. If you have not received your tax notice, please contact the Village Office at 250-367-7551.

REMEMBER: If you are eligible for the Provincial Homeowner Grant, you must apply for it ON OR BEFORE July 2 to avoid a 10% penalty. The form is located at the bottom of your tax notice; fill it out and mail it or bring it to the Village Office. Payment of property taxes is not required to apply for your grant. You must still apply for your Homeowner Grant if:

- Your financial institution pays your property taxes on your behalf;
- You pay your property taxes by internet banking; or
- You are on the Village's prepayment plan.

Cash, cheque (including post-dated), debit, and internet banking are the accepted forms of payment. (**If using debit, please confirm the daily limit on your card with your financial institution.**)

CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS: The Village of Fruitvale **DOES NOT** accept credit cards for utility and tax payments at the Village Office, however there is an online option for those residents wishing to use a credit card called PayTM Canada.

Register at <u>https://www.paytm.ca/</u> or download the **Pdyim** app from the Google Play Store or the Apple App Store, link your credit card, search for "Fruitvale Village of Property Taxes and/or Fruitvale Village of Utilities from the list of payees, enter the property tax account number (last 8 digits without the decimal of the roll number listed at the top of your tax notice), name, and the amount of payment, review the details and proceed to checkout. Please ensure you allow 5 days for the payment to be received by the Village. There is no cost to either parties to use this method of payment.

All unpaid property taxes, <u>including outstanding homeowner grants</u>, will be assessed a 10% penalty on July 3.

FLOWERING FRUITVALE

The Flowering Fruitvale flower basket campaign, which helps with the costs incurred for the purchase, installation and maintenance of the downtown hanging flower baskets, is underway again this year. Your donations help sponsor a beautiful flowerfilled basket, supplied by Nipkow Greenhouse.

Donations of \$25, \$50, \$75 or \$100 can be made in recognition or in memory of a special person, or an event such as a birth, anniversary, or birthday and will be acknowledged on the Village website and on the board at the Village Office. We will also send an acknowledgement card to the person of your choice to advise that a donation has been made in their honour. Donations of any value are welcomed and greatly appreciated however only those donations of \$25 or more will be recognized on the board. **All donations over \$20.00 will receive a Charitable tax receipt.** The Village of Fruitvale hangs approximately 50 baskets each summer. If you are interested in sponsoring a basket, please visit the Village Office to make your donation and take pride in **"FLOWERING FRUITVALE".**

UNTIDY PREMISES:

The Village Office has received some complaints regarding properties in contravention of the 'Property Standards Bylaw' by having piles of debris such as construction material, garbage, tree-clippings and/or yard waste, lawns not being maintained, noxious weeds growing, etc. Not only is the accumulation of these items unsightly and in contravention of the Village bylaw, it is a fire hazard to you and your neighbours. We ask that owners who have property in contravention of the bylaw remove the debris and keep the property maintained to the standards required. The Bylaw Enforcement Officer will start issuing warning notices to properties with an accumulation of debris, noxious weeds and/or yards not being maintained. Please take the necessary steps to clean up and maintain your property otherwise the Village will enforce the bylaw to have it cleaned up at the owner's expense.

GARBAGE COLLECTION FREQUENCY CHANGE

Village of Fruitvale residents are reminded that garbage collection is now weekly until October. Please ensure garbage is not placed at the curb until 7:00 am on your garbage day. This will help keep the bears from tearing into it and dragging garbage all over the Village. Your garbage should be kept in a garbage can with the lid tightly secured and kept in a secured shed or garage until the morning of garbage day to avoid attracting bears. Visit https://wildsafebc.com/black-bear/ for more helpful hints on how to be bear aware. We all must do our part! There is no change to recycling collection schedule.

NOXIOUS WEEDS:

We ask that if you have noxious weeds growing that you take steps to get rid of them. This will help keep both your yard and your neighbours' free from weeds. We also ask that if you own an empty lot that you take steps to keep the lot weed-free and mowed/trimmed. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

BEAVER VALLEY WATER REGULATIONS/RESTRICTIONS

Level 1 water regulations, listed below, are in effect for the Beaver Valley Water System until further notice:

- Odd numbered houses water on odd numbered days
- Even numbered houses water on even numbered days
- Only one sprinkler per household
- Sprinkling times are restricted to the following hours:
 - ◊ 7:00 am 10:00 am
 ◊ 7:00 pm 10:00 pm
- Underground sprinklers are to be set to water between:
 - ◊ 1:00 am 6:00 am for 20-minute intervals per zone
- Ensure water stays on your lawn and garden and does not run down your driveway or onto the street
- Please refrain from sprinkling when it is raining.

For those users with underground sprinkler systems, please do not use an above ground sprinkler in conjunction with an underground sprinkler system; it's one or the other. Thank you for your cooperation.

BURNING REGULATIONS

Village of Fruitvale residents are reminded that open burning in the Village is prohibited throughout the year. Only .5 metre x .5 metre backyard campfires are allowed and use only dry seasoned firewood. Please have a water hose readily available. Extinguish your fire when left unattended.

Currently in the Southeast Fire District there are no burning restrictions in place for campfires or Category 2 and Category 3 open fires. It is important to exercise caution when you are outdoors, not only when enjoying a campfire or off-roading in the backcountry, but also in using tools and handling, storing and disposing of materials and fuels.

Prevention means stopping wildfires before they start. Discarded cigarette butts, campfires, hot exhaust pipes coming in contact with dry grass and vegetation, power tools (such as chainsaws), Tiki torches and even discarded glass can all ignite a wildfire. The conditions in the Southeast Fire Area are dry so we all must do our part to prevent human-caused wildfires and protect

public safety.



Utilities, Taxes & Home Owner Grants

Frequently Asked Questions

In-person

Pay with cash, debit, or a cheque at the Village Office, 1947 Beaver Street. The Village does not accept payment by credit card. After office hours, deposit payment and/or HOG in the mail slot at the front door.

Online Banking

Set up Fruitvale Village of Taxes' and/or 'Fruitvale Village of Utilities' as a payee with your bank. Use your Roll Number found on the top right corner your notice as your account number.

Credit Card Payments

- Download Pdyine app from the Google Play Store or the Apple App Store,
- Search for "Fruitvale Village of Property Taxes and/or Fruitvale Village of Utilities from the list of payees.

3. Enter the property tax account number (last 8 digits without the decimal of the roll number listed at the top of your tax notice), name, and the amount of payment,

4. Review the details and proceed to checkout.

Preauthorized Payment Plan

Contact the Village Office for information or to register for the Prepayment Plan.

Can I prepay my Utilities and Property Taxes?

Yes. Home owners can make payments to their utility and tax accounts at any time.

The Village also has a Preauthorized Prepayment Plan that home owners can take advantage of to pay their property taxes and/or utilities over the course of 12 months. This is a prepayment plan for the next year's utilities and taxes, therefore all current taxes and utilities must be paid prior to starting the prepayment plan. Utilities and Taxes are split into 12 equal payments and withdrawn from your bank account on the 4th of every month.

My Property Taxes are in Arrears, can I pay them in installments?

Yes; however, the Village does not have a prepayment plan for arrears and/or delinquent taxes. Home owners can set up recurring payments through their online banking or can make payments in person at the Village Office at any time.

Do I Qualify for a Home Owner Grant? If so, how do I claim it?

To qualify for the Home Owner Grant, you must live in your home and it must be your principal residence. To claim the HOG, complete the lower portion of your tax notice and return it to the Village Office prior to the property tax due date. Home Owner Grants cannot be applied for online.

Do I still have to apply for the Home Owner Grant if I am not paying the Property Taxes before the due date?

Yes. You need to apply for the HOG before the property tax due date to avoid any penalties.

My financial institution pays my Property Taxes, do I still have to apply for the Home Owner Grant?

Yes. You must apply for the Home Owner Grant if your financial institution pays your Property Taxes on your behalf <u>before</u> the property tax due date.

I forgot to apply for my Home Owner Grant last year, can I still apply for it?

Yes, you can apply for last year's grant retroactively if you qualified for the grant on December 31st of last year and you are still the registered owner. If the property taxes for last year have been paid, you must have been the one who paid those taxes.
