VILLAGE OF FRUITVALE PROPERTY TAXES

Village of Fruitvale 2020 property tax notices have been sent out. If you have not received your tax notice by June 10, or if you have questions regarding how to pay your taxes electronically, please contact the Village Office, 250-367-7551 or **info@village.fruitvale.bc.ca**.

HOW TO PAY YOUR ANNUAL PROPERTY TAXES DURING THIS DIFFICULT TIME:

• Cheque, money order, bank draft:

Attach your cheque to the Home Owner Grant portion of your tax notice (found on the bottom of the tax notice) and place in our mail slot to the lower left of the front door or mail it through Canada Post. Be sure to complete the Home Owner Grant if you are eligible to claim. We happily accept post-dated cheques.

• Online banking:

This is available with the <u>Credit Union, Scotiabank, CIBC and BMO</u> ONLY. Find us under "Fruitvale, Village – Property Tax. Depending on the requirements of your financial institution, use at least the last 6 digits of your folio number without the 521 and the decimal point. For example Folio No. 521 00123.456 would be 123456. If more digits are required, use more zeros. For example Folio No. 521 00123.456 would be 00000123456. Be sure to send in your completed Home Owner Grant slip from the bottom of your tax notice, if you are eligible to claim. <u>Your Home Owner Grant *will not* be claimed without the completed form being returned to the Village Office.</u>

• E-Transfer:

Send your payment to **finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca**. We are set up for auto deposit, so no password is required. However, you <u>must write your Folio number</u> in the messages to ensure the payment is applied to the correct account. Be sure to send in your completed Home Owner Grant slip from the bottom of your tax notice if you are eligible to claim. <u>Your Home Owner Grant **will not**</u> be claimed without the completed form being returned to the Village Office.

• Credit Card using the Pay TM Canada app Only:

Download the app to your electronic device. To set up a new payee Search for "Fruitvale", select property tax. Locate the 11-digit folio number on the front of this Property Tax notice. Use the 11-digit number without any spaces or decimals e.g. 52100543000 as your account number. Be sure to send in your completed Home Owner Grant slip from the bottom of your tax notice if you are eligible to claim. Your Home Owner Grant will not be claimed without the completed form being returned to the Village Office.

CHANGES TO PROPERTY TAX DEFERMENTS

• B.C. residential property owners can now apply for property tax deferments on their principal residence online, quickly, and easily. And for the first time, owners can choose to auto renew their application.

• Municipalities will no longer be responsible for accepting deferment applications. Property owners deferring their taxes will still apply for their Home Owner Grant and make outstanding utility payments to the municipality.

FRUITVALE MEMORIAL CEMETERY

The artificial flowers placed in the Fruitvale Memorial Cemetery have been moved for the season and can be picked up just inside the cemetery gates until June 10. Any left after that day will be disposed of by the public works department. From May 1 to September 30, only real flowers are permitted in the cemetery. Maintenance at the cemetery takes place on Fridays, therefore any flowers on gravesites will be disposed on Fridays.


