

Mayor's Message

Councillors Fitzpatrick, Kenny, and I attended the Union of BC Municipalities Conference in Vancouver at the end of September. We attended many different educational/information sessions and on the last day had a meeting with the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing Selina Robinson and her staff. Local Affordable Housing representative Lila Cresswell, Area A Director Ali Grieve and our MLA Katrine Conroy and her assistant joined us in support of our proposed land/housing development. We laid out the team we've assembled and the groundwork we've done to date; Minister Robinson commended us on the amount of work done and encouraged us to keep working with BC Housing as we take the next steps. The first step going forward is to develop a masterplan for the site, to that end the Village has advertised a Request for Proposals from interested parties to help us plan the site. We are excited to have received nine proposals which we will evaluate over the coming week and follow with awarding a contract to the successful proponent. When we complete the selection process we will meet with the successful provider and plan the process including public consultation.

Council is currently working our way through updating Village policies. Many policies haven't been updated for years so our CAO is bringing forward five or six polices a month for us to update and approve.

This year we had to close the downtown community garden space as the lot it was on was privately owned and the lot sold. The Village owns property on the creek across the road from the former garden and we have plans to rebuild the garden on that site. We have applied for a grant to build the new Community Garden as well as a "Harvest Hut". This will be a small shed where people can bring excess produce from their gardens to share with the community.

We are also planning to improve the pedestrian railway crossing on the highway to make it smoother & safer for everyone including mobility challenged people on scooters. If you are aware of any other mobility challenges in the Village let us know so we can make plans to address them if possible.

This month we will be holding the annual Remembrance Day service at the Cenotaph at 10:45 am on November 11th. Please come out to honor those lost and our veterans.

Park's Siding School is a provincially

designated historical site owned by the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary. The one-room log building on the site was constructed in 1912 on property owned by J.R. (Jack) Bell. It was relocated from the Bell property to the one-acre Park's Siding property where a different, wood frame school-house stood from 1922 to 1943 when it burned down.

Park's Siding School is now a school museum and houses historical pieces collected by the Beaver Valley & Pend D'Oreille Historical Society via local residents, churches, the Trail Museum, the Nelson School District and other generous individuals and organizations.
