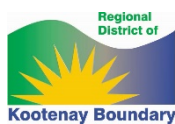

PROPERTY TAX SALE

The Village of Fruitvale's 2018 Tax Sale will be held at 10:00am sharp on Monday, September 24, 2018 at the Village of Fruitvale Office.

Letters have been sent to those property owners in a tax sale situation. If your property taxes are in delinquent status (three years of unpaid taxes - 2016, 2017 and 2018) you **must** pay the delinquent (2016) taxes **before** September 24, 2018 to keep your property from tax sale. Payment of delinquent taxes **must** be made by cash, certified cheque, or bank transfer of funds.

PUBLIC WORKS – SEWER MAIN LINES CLEANING

The Village of Fruitvale Public Works Department will continue cleaning the sewer main lines in the northwest section of the Village (the area north of the railroad tracks and west of Kootenay Avenue North). During this process, affected residents are advised to close the lids on their toilets to neutralize the chance for discharge. Residents may also note some gurgling sounds from the drains during this line cleaning.

WINTER PREPARATIONS

It's not too early to start thinking about winter preparation. Please remember that off-street parking will take effect for the winter months. Recreational vehicles, basketball hoops, construction material, solar lights, flower planters, etc., must be removed from the boulevards by mid-October.

Residents with fences or landscaping bordering Village streets are reminded that crews will store snow alongside private property boundaries to retain sufficient street width. Therefore, residents are advised to design and treat perimeter landscaping and fencing appropriately to minimize impacts. While the public works department takes extreme care when pushing back snow, the Village of Fruitvale is not responsible for damage to fences or other objects that may occur while performing regular duties.

Nomination packages are available at the Village of Fruitvale Office, 1947 Beaver Street, Fruitvale, BC until the close of the nomination period, 4:00 pm Friday, September 14, 2018.

QUALIFICATIONS OF NOMINATORS

A nomination must be made separately for each candidate by **at least two qualified nominators** of the Village of Fruitvale. A qualified nominator **must** be an elector of the Village of Fruitvale. A qualified nominator can sign as many nomination documents as there are persons to be elected to the applicable office.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE

A person is qualified to be nominated, elected, and to hold office as a member of local government if they meet the following criteria:

- Canadian citizen;
- 18 years of age or older on general voting day, October 20, 2018;
- resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day nomination papers are filed;
- person or the commander of an armed forces unit who has been granted freedom of the municipality, if that person is a Canadian citizen; and
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from being nominated for, being elected to or holding the office, or be otherwise disqualified by law.

CAMPAIGN PERIOD EXPENSE LIMITS

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*, for the 2018 general local election, the following expense limits for candidates during the campaign period apply:

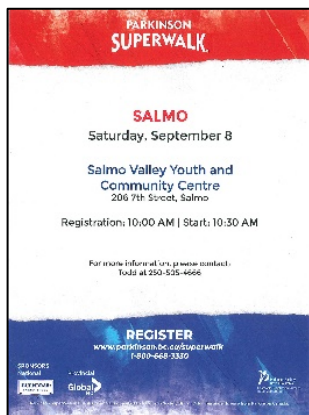

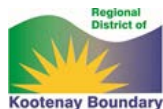

BEAVER VALEY RECREATION UPDATE – FALL 2018

Beaver Valley Recreation has had a busy summer with park and arena upgrades and the construction of a new hiking trail.

Park Upgrades:

- Expansion of campsites at the Beaver Valley Family Park
- Upgraded sprinkler system at Mazzochi Park
- Painted the washroom at Mazzochi Park

Beaver Valley Arena Upgrades:

- Upgraded the conference room
- Purchased a new Ford F250 truck
- Replaced the chiller, refrigeration plant receivers, domestic boilers and the Zamboni hot water tank

New Trail Construction:

A new, non-motorized trail off Webster Road in Fruitvale is under construction and scheduled to open October 2018.

BC CRIME STOPPERS

Do you have information on a crime but don't know who to tell? Contact BC Crime Stoppers. All information is given anonymously. Crime Stoppers will never ask your identity. For more information on BC Crime Stoppers visit their website at <http://bccrimestoppers.com/>

How to report information or leave a tip:

- Individuals who have any information that will assist investigators are encouraged to call Crime Stoppers toll free at 1-800-222-TIPS.
- Crime Stoppers takes information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Calls are not recorded and Crime Stoppers does not use call display, guaranteeing that your identity remains anonymous.
- People providing information will be given a secret code number. If your tip leads to an arrest, you may earn a cash reward of up to \$2,000, which can be claimed with your code number.
- You will never be asked to identify yourself or testify in court.

History of Crime Stoppers

The Crime Stoppers program was the brainchild of Canadian-born Detective Greg MacAleese in Albuquerque New Mexico in 1976.

The first programs in BC were formed in 1982 and the numbers grew culminating in the formation of the BC Crime Stoppers Society in 1994. The mandate is to represent the independent community-based programs at the provincial level. Today they number twenty-three programs who represent all areas of the province outside of the Metro Vancouver. They provide all communities that they represent with several messaging mediums allowing the public to forward information anonymously to Crime Stoppers, who in turn, deliver that information or intelligence to the appropriate enforcement agency, so that a crime or potential crime can be solved.

Crime Stoppers doesn't want your name; They just want your information.
