



THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF FRUITVALE

BYLAW 921, 2020

A bylaw to authorize the laying of a Municipal Ticket Information
and the issuing of a summons by means of a ticket

WHEREAS *Community Charter* Section 264 (1) empowers the Village of Fruitvale to, by bylaw, designate those bylaws for which Municipal Ticket Information may be used as a means of bylaw enforcement;

AND WHEREAS *Community Charter* Section 264 (1) empowers the Council to, by bylaw, authorize the use of any word or expression on a Municipal Ticket Information to designate an offence against a bylaw;

AND WHEREAS *Community Charter* Section 264 (1) empowers the Council to, by bylaw, set fine amounts in consultation with the Chief Judge of the Provincial Court not exceeding \$1,000.00 for contravention of the designated bylaws;

AND WHEREAS the Council designates bylaw enforcement officers for the purpose of enforcing bylaws by means of a prescribed form of ticket;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Fruitvale, in open meeting assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as "Municipal Ticket Information Bylaw No. 921, 2020."
2. The bylaws listed in Column 1 of Schedule 1 of this Bylaw may be enforced by means of a ticket in the form prescribed for the purpose of Section 264(1) of the *Community Charter*.
3. The persons who act in the job position or title listed in Column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Bylaw are designated as bylaw enforcement officers pursuant to Section 264(1)(b) of the *Community Charter* for the purpose of enforcing the bylaws listed in Column 1 of Schedule 1 opposite the respective job positions.
4. The words or expressions set forth in Column 1 of Schedules 2 through 9 to this bylaw designates the offence committed under the bylaw section numbers appearing in Column 2 of Schedules 2 through 9 opposite the respective word or expressions.
5. The amounts appearing in Column 3 of Schedules 2 through 9 to this bylaw are fines for the corresponding offences designated in Column 1 of Schedules 2 through 9 of this bylaw.
