Area A 2021 Census - Recounted and Corrected!

Earlier this year, I initiated a recount of the Area A population numbers following publication of the 2021 Census numbers that showed a 14% decline in the Area A population. I sent a letter to Stats Canada and to our Member of Parliament: Richard Cannings in the spring requesting a review and correction. That resulted in a recount of some local neighbourhoods that we knew had been missed. Please see the changes in the table below. These numbers really DO matter as Provincial and Federal transfer payments to all communities are calculated based on population. Having everyone complete the census forms is also as important as having the counts done properly. I was pretty impressed with the details of the review, and how quickly it was corrected!

Updates on Fruitvale Elementary School

A few months ago, I wrote about the need for upgrades to Fruitvale's elementary school. Mayors Morisette, Walsh and I wrote letters to School District 20, advocating for improvements to both the interior and exterior of the school. Some of that work has begun! School District Reps advised that Phase 1, happening now, is the re-cladding of the entire school which is expected to be completed by April 2023. Some window replacement will also be part of Phase 1. Phases 2 and 3 will not commence until Phase 1 is complete and new money is budgeted from the Ministry of Education.

There is a commitment to complete all three stages over the next three years, if not sooner. We local politicians are grateful to the School District and the Province for the needed upgrades. The "look" of the school does matter as it reflects the overall aesthetic of our beautiful village.

General Updates

Beaver Valley Manor: also getting a nice new look! Thanks to a very dedicated Manor Board and a funding partnership with Columbia Basin Trust.

The **Pickleball Court** at Beaver Valley Family Park nears completion with landscaping and fencing still in the works. We will have a ribbon cutting on **September 7th** and hope to have some experts join us to demonstrate the game. That event will take place from 4 pm to 6 pm with many **door prizes** to be given away! Please join us!

The **Bocce Court** behind the Hall adjacent to Creekside Campground is still in the planning stages, as the Village continues to develop and finalize plans for the whole green space on the creek.

Parking at Mazzochi: The Beaver Valley Recreation Committee wrote a follow up letter to the Village of Fruitvale on June 1st regarding the purchase of #1705 Columbia Gardens Road, the property adjacent to Mazzochi Park. The BV Rec committee has been invited by the Village to discuss this proposal which will help to address parking concerns. Stay tuned.

QUALIFICATIONS OF NOMINATORS

A nomination must be made separately for each candidate by **at least two qualified nominators** of the Village of Fruitvale. A qualified nominator **must** be an elector of the Village of Fruitvale. A qualified nominator can sign as many nomination documents as there are persons to be elected to the applicable office.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE

A person is qualified to be nominated, elected, and to hold office as a member of local government if they meet the following criteria:

- Canadian citizen;
- 18 years of age or older on general voting day, October 15, 2022;
- resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day nomination papers are filed;
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from being nominated for, being elected to or holding the office, or be otherwise disqualified by law.

CAMPAIGN PERIOD EXPENSE LIMITS

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*, for the 2022 general local election, the following expense limits for candidates during the campaign period apply:

Mayor - \$10,797.83

Councillor - \$5,398.92

THIRD PARTY ADVERTISING LIMITS

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*, for the 2022 general local elections, the following third-party advertising limits apply: \$809.84

Village of Fruitvale Property Tax Sale

The Village of Fruitvale's 2022 Tax Sale is scheduled for 10:00 am sharp on Monday, September 26, 2022 at the Village of Fruitvale Office.

Letters have been sent to those property owners in a tax sale situation. If your property taxes are in delinquent status (three years of unpaid taxes - 2020, 2021 and 2022) you must pay the delinquent (2020) taxes before 9:59 am September 26, 2022 to keep your property from being sold at the tax sale.

A listing of tax sale properties will appear in the September 20 and 22 editions of the Trail Times. In order to keep your property from appearing in the newspaper advertisements, the delinquent taxes must be paid in full prior to September 15, 2022.

Payment of delinquent taxes must be made by cash, certified cheque, online banking or electronic transfer of funds.

The Beaver Valley Water Service is currently in **Stage 3** (as of August 4th). Most lawns only require about 1 inch of water per week, which usually requires about 20 minutes, or less of watering on the allowed days for a typical sprinkler system.

To help keep your lawn happy in the heat here are some summer lawn care tips:

- Water in the early morning or evening to help reduce evaporation
- Ensure the blade on your lawn mower is sharp
- Keep foot traffic on your lawn to a minimum
- Put off lawn projects like aerating, dethatching and fertilization until it is cooler

The RDKB WaterSmart Ambassador Program ran throughout the summer months informing residents of the Beaver Valley Water Service of ways they can reduce their water use. The WaterSmart program aimed to educate residents about their water use and urged residents to be WaterSmart.

The WaterSmart Program, with financial help from FortisBC, offered free indoor water conservation kits to residents in the Beaver Valley Water Service. These kits included a low flow showerhead, kitchen faucet aerator, and bathroom faucet aerator. Many residents in the Beaver Valley Water Service took advantage of this offer.

Sprinkler system assessments were also offered by the WaterSmart Ambassador throughout the summer. These assessments were a great way to reduce water use as sprinkler systems were checked for leaks and broken sprinkler heads. The distribution of water by these sprinkler systems was also examined and a custom water schedule was developed for each system. These assessments were done on the Village of Fruitvale's public spaces, including Vale Park, Railway Park, Haines Park, and the Cemetery. Thank you to everyone who signed up for sprinkler system assessments.

Thank you everyone for participating in the WaterSmart Program in 2022 and making an effort to reduce your water use this summer!


