Hard to believe it is the last month of the year already! December, along with ringing in the Holiday Season, is a time to reflect on the year that has been.

2022 was a busy, eventful year in Fruitvale! Following the funding announcement from the Provincial Government, construction planning work moved forward on the 31-unit Affordable Housing Complex in phase one of the Middle School Site Masterplan. Planning in earnest also began for the 37-seat Childcare Centre in phase one of the same site as our application for childcare funding was announced as well.

Work continued this fall to help REN Energy towards getting shovels in the ground to build the proposed renewable natural gas facility east of Fruitvale which will create dozens of well paid jobs on site and in our area.

Village staff underwent a positive transformation following an extensive search for a new CAO throughout the summer. People moved into positions more suited to their skillset and we worked hard to find and hire a progressive, engaged new CAO.

Fruitvale Council also went through a transformation this fall with the election in October as three of four council positions were filled by new councillors. While it is sad to see councillors/friends leave, following each election the new council brings new ideas and energy to the table. We are now working on getting everyone up to speed and looking forward to the positive work our team will do going forward this term.

We need to take the time to recognize that this year we also said final goodbyes to several longtime community leaders who will be sadly missed for who they were as people as well as their contributions to the community.

On behalf of Village Council and Staff, I would like to wish everyone the Happiest of Holiday Seasons and remind everyone to reach out and support the many friends and neighbours that are in need, particularly in this holiday season.

Residents should not be calling Fortis to report non-working streetlights. We will need the location of the streetlight, the number on the pole and the problem with the light. If it's easier, you can even take a photo of the number on the pole and email it to the office.

SNOW REMOVAL

The snow is here and so are the snow removal reminders to residents:

- Residents are reminded that all vehicles must be removed from boulevards and off-street parking must be provided for your visitors so vehicles do not impede the snow removal process. Vehicles restricting snow removal will be towed at the owner's expense. Warnings will not be issued.
- If you move snow from private property onto any street or sidewalk, you will be invoiced by the Village for time spent clearing the snow.
- Please **do not place plastic or tarps on the boulevard**, this is dangerous for our crew and damages equipment if the plow catches it.
- Please be aware that the Public Works Department maintains only that portion of Bluebird Road from Highway 3B to Scout Road. The remainder of Bluebird Road is maintained YRB. Residents may notice that all of Bluebird Road may not be plowed at the same time.
- RDKB Area 'A' residents please note that YRB is in charge of maintaining your roads. If there is a problem with snow removal, please contact YRB 1-888-630-1420 or the Ministry of Transportation in Nelson at 250-354-6400.

Safety Notes:

- Please keep children safe and do not allow them to play on snow banks next to roads or on windrows in the middle of streets.
- Trucks and plows frequently slow down, turn and back up please stay well back from trucks and plows at all times for the safety of both you and the snow plowing crew.
- Ensure weather-appropriate footwear is worn when walking on streets and sidewalks.

CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

The Village of Fruitvale will once again be taking Christmas trees to the landfill free of charge after the Christmas season. Please bring your tree to the designated area (look for the sign) in the Pole Yard before January 15. There will be no curb-side tree collection. Please ensure all decorations and plastic tree bags have been removed when you drop off your tree.

2023 DOG TAGS (licenses)

Just a reminder to dog owners - all dogs in the Village and RDKB are required to be licensed. A dog tag (license) on your dog will ensure that it is returned to you if it is found out of your yard. It's a small price to pay for the safe return of your family pet.

Please remember that it is a contravention of the Animal Responsibility Bylaw No. 922 to allow your dogs to run free. Dogs at large run the risk of being picked up by the SPCA and fines will be levied to the dog owner.

Please, for the safety, peace and comfort of your neighbours, ensure your dog(s) are secure in your house or yard and do not let them bark continually at all hours day and night.

Village residents who purchased dog tags in 2022, please note: you will be receiving an invoice for the 2023 dog tag/license fee but you will not be receiving a new tag, unless your dog has lost its tag. If there are any changes to the information on your invoice, please contact the office so we can update our files.

BV MAY DAYS KIDDIE CARS

The iconic BV May Days kiddie cars! Oh, how the tots of the Beaver Valley miss you, especially the grown-up tots from the Valley! Mama, Papa, Grandma, Grandpa – Y'all rode in these CARS!

The kiddie cars have been in operation since about 1948, then donated to the Village of Fruitvale by the Lions Club! Beaver Valley May Days operated the kiddie cars every year since! Sadly, you have not seen them at BV May Days since 2018.

As it turns out, the ride is deemed a regulated amusement device by Technical Safety BC standards. The May Days committee was required to present documentation of an engineering and inspection report! The non-profit Public Access Protection Society is directing the project and would like to thank RDKB Area 'A' Director Ali Grieve, Columbia Basin Trust and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 1003 for their funding of the project. The kiddie cars' required engineering documents are now complete, thanks to REDWOOD Engineering Ltd. of Trail BC who completed the engineering report. Thank you!

There are still a few other non-compliance items that need to be addressed before Technical Safety BC will sign off so the ride can operate. **We are seeking donations to fund the remainder of this project!** We are required to have seat belts in each car, a sweep cover, exhaust pipe and fencing! We would also like to give the cars a fresh coat of paint! Allan Macaulay from Waneta Old Wheels of Trail, BC will be doing the work on the final stages of this important project so the kiddie cars will be ready to operate at the 2023 BV May Days! We are so close to having our community ride back up and running! Let's keep the kiddie cars going another 74 years!
