Each of our seasons have so much outdoor recreation to offer. This year Beaver Valley Recreation will launch our Recreation Master Plan. With your help, we hope to capture and review recreation opportunities in the Valley. The BV Rec. Committee will talk to user groups and residents, asking questions such as, What are your levels of participation? Are the user groups growing or declining? What are the barriers to participation? What incentives might be offered to increase awareness and participation? How can we best communicate the recreational opportunities?

Some desired outcomes:

- Establish community-based priorities for current & future recreational facilities & services, identifying trends, gaps and needs.
- Create a framework for decision-making based on facility status, community needs, regional amenities and financial considerations.
- Use demographic data to assist in determining needs & priorities for residents.
- Review the current local & regional systems to evaluate their utilization & efficiency.

A contract for this master plan has been awarded to Expedition Consulting, who will begin the process with our BV Rec Committee, followed by public consultation beginning in late March or early April. We look forward to your input!

Mayor Steve Morissette - March 2023 Update

I hope everyone is enjoying winter or at least are healthy and happy - spring is around the corner! It is a busy winter for our new council. I think our new councilors will agree the learning curve and the work load is high at this time of year as we hold multiple budget meetings in addition to our regular council meetings. The budget is challenging this year for the Village as it is with residents. The prices for everything we need and use have escalated as not seen in decades. We know there must be an increase in taxes to maintain the service levels resident's need. I am seeing the same scenario at the Regional District table, and as you know, the Regional District budget is an add-on to our Village tax notices.

We have projects to watch for this spring/summer. Through grant funding we have been able to hire a consultant to assist us in developing an "active transportation plan". This plan identifies where we lack safe and accessible paths, sidewalks, and trails that allow us to walk, cycle, skateboard, use a mobility scooter or wheelchair to and from amenities throughout the community. I'm sure we can all identify some current weaknesses we have in getting from the north side of the Valley to the south side and vice versa. An active transportation plan will provide the safest solutions to issues such as these and identify and offer solutions to other issues with getting safely around our community. We will be reaching out for residents' input while building the plan. Stay tuned.

Two more projects gearing up for this year are our 37-seat daycare breaking ground this spring and tentatively opening in October, 2023 with our 31-unit housing complex following closely behind with a tentative September date to break ground. Exciting times in our town!

A huge shout out to the volunteers that put on a super fun "Up to Snow Good" winter celebration on a sunny day at Mazzochi Park on Saturday February 18! I saw a lot of families and smiles, it was a wonderful event, thank you! Volunteers add so much to our community; they add the colour and flavour that gives life and character to our Valley. Please find some time in your life to commit to even one thing in our community. Every organization is in need of volunteers. If you have an interest in anything from seniors to bowling, curling, x-country skiing, Special Olympics, junior hockey, thrift store, food bank, May Days or anything else that appeals to you...volunteer - these groups need your help.

2023 VILLAGE OF FRUITVALE WATER, SEWER AND GARBAGE USER FEES

The 2023 water, sewer and garbage utility bills were sent out March 1. A 5% discount is offered until March 31 on utilities and extra packages of garbage bags. If you have not received your utility bill by March 13, please contact the Village Office.

Payment options are as follows:

* Cheques, bank drafts and/or money orders hand delivered, mailed to or placed in the drop box at the Village Office;

* Online banking through your financial institution (Royal Bank and TD Bank excluded);

* E-transfers sent to: finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca - It is very important that you reference your account number, property address and what you are paying so your payment is applied to the correct account. The Village is set up as an automatic deposit.

The Village of Fruitvale has a monthly preauthorized prepayment plan for utilities and property taxes. This is a prepayment plan for next year's utilities and property taxes. Current charges must be paid before the prepayment plan can begin. For more information and details on the preauthorized prepayment plan, please contact Misti at the Village Office.

The package of garbage bags included with the utility billing can be picked-up beginning March 1. If you forgot to pick up last year's package you can still do so.

The utility fees need not to be paid prior to picking up this package of bags.


