



# **MESSAGE FROM MAYOR MORISSETTE**





Good afternoon everyone and thank you so much for choosing to meet in Fruitvale, we are very happy to have you here this afternoon.

Thank you so much for the opportunity to talk about Fruitvale and our role in what some call the Greater Trail Area, I prefer to call us the Greater Fruitvale area, it's exciting talking about our project's past, present, and future.

We are gathered in our beautiful Hall that has been supported by CBT for many projects both within and surrounding the Hall, our senior's gym downstairs, our RV Park behind the Hall, additionally the purchase of the piece of land bordering the creek behind the Hall was purchased with your support.

Going forward we have lots of plans on the books that we have shared with your very helpful Community Liaison. We have a plan to make the land I mentioned behind the Hall a community gathering/event space with a gazebo and other amenities, this will be a welcome addition for outdoor celebrations and gatherings that then have the comfort and convenience of our well equipped commercial kitchen and indoor Hall space.

Beyond this space we are building a plan for lower Creekside Park on the far side of the bridge with plans to remove a crumbling retaining wall and fence to allow creek access for summer recreation and double as a flood mitigation area during freshet.

Alongside the historic tracks that planted the seed for Fruitvale in 1893 is Railway Park. CBT supported us in the construction of this park, and also committed to support the Train Station which Ali spoke to or will speak to.

Our former Middle School property up near the Fruitvale ball parks and Arena is also developing with the support of CBT. We were supported from the beginning in building a 3-phase masterplan for the 3.7 ha site, it is about 4 years since we had the completed masterplan in hand and we are very happy to say we are well on our way to having Phase One of the masterplan complete.

In Phase One, we are opening our new 37-seat daycare soon; behind the daycare, ground was recently broken for 31 units of affordable housing, we are partnered with the LCAHS on with both projects supported by CBT; and the last piece of the Phase One property is on BC Bid as we speak with a handful of developers interested to build multi-family housing with about 12-14 units. These are key pieces to the economic development and sustainability of Fruitvale.

We realized that adding daycare and significant housing next door to our parks and arena meant we should build a long term plan for the park. Council engaged all of the user groups to build a plan that works for all ages and abilities at the parks. We will accomplish the plan over the course 8-10 years; this year's opportunity is to refurbish and add artificial turf to our little league park. Artificial turf has many environmental benefits - it eliminates sprinkling, fertilizing, use of herbicides, and mowing. Our awesome staff led the granting opportunity with the Toronto Blue Jays Foundation and we were successful in the first round towards \$250,000. The next step is to build an accurate budget and work with a supporting partner to be ultimately successful.

We were very fortunate to be successful in a government grant to build an active transportation plan for Fruitvale. We are also a partner in the South Kootenay Green Link steering committee lead by the RDKB to build a non-motorized commuter link between Rossland and Fruitvale connecting all communities in between. Both projects will be knocking on your door after plans are completed.

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# MESSAGE FROM MAYOR MORISSETTE continued

I'd be remiss if I didn't mention the Resident Directed or Redi Grants. Dozens of projects that wouldn't otherwise have happened were completed by our member owned and operated curling and golf clubs, as well as Camp Tweedsmuir Scout Camp, the BV Snowmobile club, and the X-country Ski Club, minor sports, food bank, thrift store and many others. I must highlight the Beaver Valley Manor. For those that don't know, we have had a two storey 40 apartment affordable housing complex down the street run by the BV Manor Society for nearly 50 years. People can still access a one bedroom apartment for \$519 or a bachelor suite for \$482 including everything but telephone & internet for which the society has negotiated a low group rate. There are no government subsidies for this facility. The chairperson of the Society asked me to thank you profusely because they couldn't continue to do this without your support. She told me they have received over \$220,000 of CBT support for upgrades since 2012, a big portion of that through the resident directed stream.

Everything we are doing in Fruitvale has an eye to making Fruitvale sustainable, building a vibe in our downtown, and improving the quality of life for people. It's a process...in the end Fruitvale will be more financially sustainable and offer a lot more to our area.

Thank you to all of the Board of Directors for giving of your time and expertise to support and enrich life in the Columbia Basin. Columbia Basin Trust is so important to the quality of life in the Greater Fruitvale Area - we may be mini but CBT helps make us mighty.

Thank you for your tremendous support and for coming to Fruitvale this afternoon.

The Lower Columbia Affordable Housing Society and the Village of Fruitvale are pleased to welcome name suggestions from the public for the new Affordable Rental Housing building which will be located at 96 Deadmarsh Avenue, Fruitvale.

Possible names should appreal to Fruitvale residents; be simple, distinctive, and recognizable; may convey a sense of place and celebrate the distinguishing characteristics of the neighbourhood or Fruitvale area; and should respect the community's values, history, and culture, including those of the local and traditional Indigenous groups. Creativity is welcomed!

LCAHS and the Village of Fruitvale will be accepting names until April 1, 2024. Suggestions will be accepted in writing to LCAHS, PO Box 44, Trail, BC V1R 4L3 or via the contact page of the LCAHS website, <a href="https://www.lowercolumbiahousing.ca/contact">https://www.lowercolumbiahousing.ca/contact</a>.

The LCAHS and the Village of Fruitvale will review suggestions and work together to choose the new building name. They will jointly announce the new name by May 15, 2024.

When completed in late 2025, the landmark building will have 31 units of mixed income affordable rental housing for lower income families, seniors and adults with diagnosed developmental disabilities. This project is being made possible with financial support from BC Housing, Columbia Basin Trust, Teck Trail Operations and Kootenay Savings Community Foundation.

# Expression of Interest CAMPGROUND HOST

The Regional District of Kootenay Boundary (RDKB) is seeking an onsite Campground Host for the Beaver Valley Family Park Campground for the 2024 operating season. Beaver Valley Family Park is located at Marsh Creek between Salmo and Fruitvale. The park includes 20 campsites with power and water hookups, washrooms and showers, a fully equipped kitchen, a gazebo with barbeques, a championship disc golf course, pickleball court, and children's playground.

The Beaver Valley Family Park Host will be responsible for providing a safe, sanitary, socially acceptable, and environmentally responsible recreation experience. The Host will help recover operational costs through the collection of camp fees. The Host will be required to provide personal onsite accommodation. The contract will run from May long weekend until Labour Day weekend 2024. The Host will be paid \$1,700/month for a total of \$6,500. The host will be required to provide proof of General Liability Insurance for an amount of \$5,000,000 and provide a criminal record check.
