Proud to Live in a Healthy Thriving Community

I walk through Area A and our Village nearly every day, and I've witnessed significant investments from various partners over the past several years. While growth has been modest due to limited infrastructure—particularly in water and sewer capacity—we're fortunate to see ongoing improvements thanks to strong collaborations with some key partners, including:

- Area A and the Village of Fruitvale
- Columbia Basin Trust
- Atco Wood Products
- Federal and Provincial Governments
- School District 20
- And surprisingly, the Toronto Blue Jays!

Our Elementary School and local grocery store boast brand-new exteriors, and we have a state-of-theart Beaver Valley Day Care Centre adjacent to a new Affordable Housing Unit, officially named Blizzard Mountain Place. We've also introduced a fantastic new Little League Park, complete with turf provided by the Blue Jays, along with the Creekside Campground, Bocce Pit, Pickleball Court, Disc Golf, and a new Zamboni wrapped in a locomotive design that pays homage to our rail town heritage. Our arena remains one of the best maintained in the area, complemented by an exceptional Community Hall. We truly are fortunate to live in such a vibrant community.

As the approving body for our Official Community Plans, the Province of BC emphasizes the importance of density in the heart of our communities. In line with this vision, we are excited to announce another partnership with Area A and the Village of Fruitvale to develop a green space behind the Memorial Hall, featuring a new gazebo.

Area A receives approximately \$85K annually from the Canada Community Building Fund (formerly known as the Gas Tax). This is all Federal Grant money. As your representative for Area A, I am committed to pursuing investments that benefit the wider Beaver Valley community. We have also shared our engineering designs from the Beaver Creek Arbor with the Village, which will provide a strong foundation for the gazebo.

Furthermore, Area A will contribute \$200K from the CCBF to this initiative. This green space will not only enhance the area but also serve as a beautiful backdrop for events at the Hall, downtown activities, and future Farmers Markets. I look forward to seeing this project move forward!

As your elected representatives, we understand the challenges that any budget increase can bring for our residents. While it's essential to address necessary infrastructure needs and contractual tax increases, some of us feel that "good" is now "good enough." We are fortunate to live in such a remarkable community, and it's time to prioritize the maintenance of what we already have. Going forward, my focus will shift toward preserving and enhancing our existing assets, ensuring they continue to serve us well for years to come.



This will be my last Mayor's note in our Newsletter. It brings with it many emotions, I have thoroughly enjoyed my time on Council with good Councillor's that became good friends. My time on Council allowed me to sit as a Municipal Director on the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary where I added to my positive Relationships with other Mayor's, Area Director's, and Councillor's throughout our region. From that seat at the RDKB Board I was able to sit on regional committees such as Beaver Valley Recreation, the Economic Trust of the Southern Interior, West Kootenay Transit, the South Kootenay Green Link Steering Committee as well as the Kootenay Career Development Team Society. The thought of becoming our MLA was never on my radar but I really enjoyed the Regional aspect of the responsibilities I stepped into and when the opportunity to enter the race for our riding Provincially was presented, it felt right for me.

I am proud of what we have accomplished on council in the 10 years I have been on Council, 4 as a Councillor and 6 as your Mayor. We have built a Capital Reserve to assist us in replacing worn out infrastructure such as pipes in the ground, sewage treatment, roads, park upgrades. We have built Masterplans for the old School Site (and on that site built a 37 seat Daycare and are in the middle of construction of a 31 unit Housing Complex), Haines Park (Rebuilt Ryder pavilion, new fencing on the front side, new artificial turf little league park), Creekside Parks Plans, Active Transportation Plan, and became the first interior Municipality to become a certified Living Wage Employer.

With BV Recreation we have the money set aside and the plan to build a replica train station/mini museum as well as move the Historic Park School onto the Railway Park land, we are just waiting for BNSF Rail line to sign the lease so we can start construction.

Nearly all of these projects are being planned or built to bolster our tax revenue by creating a new "vibe" downtown to attract people downtown to attract new and retain our existing Business'. The Daycare and housing attract more people and taxes to the Valley to reduce the long term burden on taxpayers.

I am sad to leave my responsibilities in Fruitvale and area, but I am excited to work for everyone in our riding and the Province bringing a rural perspective to the large challenges of Healthcare, affordability, the environment, the toxic drug crisis, and public safety.






