New month, New Intentions, New Goals, New Beginnings Catherine Guesford, Deputy Mayor

As we move into February 2025, we start off with election news. The formal information about the upcoming election is attached to this newsletter, as well it will be published in the Trail Times as per Elections BC protocols. There will be two positions open in this election, one for Mayor and one for Councillor. The mayor's position became open when Steve Morrisette resigned and became the Kootenay-Monashee MLA. The Councillor position opened when Wes Startup stated he was running for Mayor. Wes' resignation is effective January 29, 2025.

The BC Elections Act states that a Councilor who runs for Mayor during a By-Election must resign from Council.

Information about how to run for office will be available at the Village of Fruitvale Office on Thursday, February 6, 2025. The elections will be held Saturday, April 05, 2025.

Council will be business as usual, but with reduced numbers. I will be your Deputy Mayor with Councillor Julia Mason and Councillor Bill Wenman, we will continue with Village business until there is a new Mayor and one new Councillor in place.

Some of the Major Projects that are ongoing or will start are as follows:

Lower Columbian Affordable Housing Society (LCAHS) Projects estimated completion date is the Fall of 2025. Bookings for space are through the LCAHS. They will advise everyone when they are ready to accept applications, for now please be patient.

The Middle School Demolition (Old Gym & Library) will be starting in the late spring. The Village will be using funds from the BC Government Community Grants for the demolition. The demolition will only be the part of the building, which is the Gym and the Library areas. Please stay out the collapsed site as it is very dangerous.

McHale Lane Wastewater Upgrades will start the Summer 2025. The downtown area lane between Rossland Collision and the Medical Centre will have construction detours. This is a very important sewer line upgrade as we are literally processing rainwater by using old pipes whenever it rains.

Green Road Water Line Replacement will be starting in the summer 2025. The RDKB water system covers parts of Area A and most of Fruitvale. We will be replacing approximately 2,000 meters of water line.

Sometime in the Spring, Council will invite everyone to the official opening of the Astro Turf Field at McInnis Park. At this time, I feel it is important to recognize the entire team for their efforts on this project.

Without mentioning any names, we need to give special kudos to:

- The Village Staff for the astro turf idea and writing up the funding grants for this amazing project, such as the Jays Care Foundation Grants (@JaysCare) along with Columbia Basin Trust;
- The Village Office staff, Public Works Staff and Beaver Valley Little League for putting it all together for the design and contract award;
- The amazing work crew who along with the contractors, got it all done.

Throughout this endeavor, we had the support Regional District Kootenay Boundary Beaver Valley Recreation Commission (Director Ali Grieve, Mayor Mike Walsh, Councillor Bill Wenman and Mark Daines,).

Celebrating One Year of RDKB HomeSmart

As RDKB HomeSmart reaches its first anniversary, the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary is celebrating the free program's success in supporting homeowners across the region. Since its launch in January 2024, RDKB HomeSmart has built strong, positive relationships with participants, collaborated with many local programs, and recently launched a first-of-its-kind guidance document.

RDKB HomeSmart was created to simplify the home retrofit process for residents by offering personalized guidance, support with hiring professional contractors and energy advisors and resources for navigating rebates and loans. Funded by the Columbia Basin Trust, FortisBC, and RDKB, and managed by RDKB's HomeSmart team, the program has quickly gained momentum, with over 200 residents participating in its first year.

"Our community has embraced the RDKB HomeSmart program, reflecting a shared commitment to building an energy efficient and resilient future, which is great to see," says Andy Morel, Chair of the RDKB Board.

One of the most popular improvements this past year has been upgrading windows and doors, a choice that appeals to residents looking to boost both comfort and efficiency. Freya Phillips, RDKB's Senior Energy Specialist, noted the enthusiastic participation from the community: "Residents have responded so positively to the program's simplicity and ease. RDKB HomeSmart has provided a clear pathway to meaningful home improvements, and it's exciting to see the positive impact it's making in our community. The first year of the program has shown encouraging results and we look forward to continually improving the program to supporting even more residents in the future."

Feedback from participants has been highly positive, with residents praising the program's personalized supportand clear guidance. Raven Atherton, RDKB's Retrofit Program Coordinator, shared: "The highlight of this first year has been speaking with the residents of the Kootenay Boundary who are eager to learn about available retrofit options and are open to new approaches for implementing them. It's been gratifying to see participants successfully start and complete their projects, big or small. Our team is there at every step, ensuring they feel supported and have access to the available benefits.

The support I received—from discussing options to finding the right rebates—has been invaluable." QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE

- Resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day nomination papers are filed;
- Not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from being nominated for, being elected

to or holding the office, or be otherwise disqualified by law.
