2025 WATER AND SEWER USER FEES

The 2025 water and sewer invoices are due April 3, 2025 to take advantage of the 5% discount. If you have not received your utility bill, please contact the Village Office by email, finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca or phone 250-367-7551.

When paying by E-transfer, please indicate in the memo section your roll/account/folio number listed on your invoice or your street address so that your payment can be applied to the correct account.



## **Regional District Budget Finalized - What it Means for Your Taxes**

On March 26, the Regional District (RD) finalized a \$95 million budget, which includes a \$27 million investment in the new Columbia Pollution Control Center (CPCC). This new facility, benefiting Warfield, Rossland, and Trail, will result in significant tax increases for these communities.

Tax time can be challenging for many, so here's a breakdown of the projected tax increases from ONLY the Regional District portion:

- Fruitvale: +7% from 2024/ Montrose: 0% from 2024/ Area A: +4% from 2024
- Rossland: +25%/ Warfield: +31%/ Trail: +33%

These increases are influenced by factors such as the services each community has chosen to participate in, as well as fluctuations in assessed property values. For example, the 4% increase in Area A, which is their total increase in taxation, is relatively low due to the area's higher asset values, which include three dams, an industrial park, and Atco Wood Products.

## How Area A Helps Relieve the Tax Burden For the Beaver Valley

Area A residents are fortunate to benefit from two streams of grant funding that support important local projects across the Beaver Valley. Here are just some examples of how these grants are invested:

- South Columbia Search and Rescue/Beaver Valley Family Park/ Library Improvements
- Beaver Valley Arena/ Beaver Creek Park: First Nations Arbor/ BV Cross Country Ski Club
- Fruitvale Elementary School/Village of Fruitvale: RV Park & Community Gardens
- Champion Lakes Golf Course/ Fruitvale Pickleball Court & \$200K for future green space
- Beaver Mountain Snowmobile Association: Backcountry Shelter
- Beaver Valley Curling Club/ Splash Park in Montrose
- Fruitvale Blooming Society & Valley Food Bank & Thrift Store
- Community Events: May Days, Jingle Down Main, Montrose Days, & Remembrance Day

This is just a partial list of the ongoing contributions from **Area A residents**, who have proudly invested over **\$1.8 million** in grant funding to improve the facilities and parks that benefit our entire Valley.

## **Annual Contributions from Area A's Dams**

In addition to the grants, **Area A's dams** make significant annual contributions to the **East End Services of the Regional District.** In total, **\$860K** is provided **each year** to support local services focused directly on community needs:

- \$500K to the Regional Fire Service/\$150K to the Transit Service
- \$10K to the Industrial Park Water Service/ and \$200K to Beaver Valley Recreation

For **Area A residents, Fruitvale** remains the hub where we gather, shop, and build lasting connections. It's the heart of the Beaver Valley, and we are proud to be partners in countless community projects.

## Blooming with excitement for April Showers

The FIRST Fruitvale Business After Business was a huge Success! This event was presented by the Trail Chamber of Commerce and Sponsored by Area A and the Village of Fruitvale. I was honoured to be gifted with the task of seeing it through!







As your Deputy Mayor I will always try to be honest and try very hard to communicate what is happening in our Village. We have to use our common sense and try to sort out the misconceptions that come when rumors are started.

Just know when you have a question and need to know something feel free to ask me a question and you will always receive an answer....and because I don't know everything, I will do my best to find the answer for you!

The issue on so many of your minds these days is the demolition of the Middle School, so let me help to clear up some of the questions and fallacies.

There are many moving parts to the demolition of the Middle School, but the most important part is **WHY** it is being demolished. The section that is being demolished is the gym area, this is where the roof collapsed which makes it a **very** dangerous area! Unfortunately, unauthorized people are still entering the restricted area at various times of the day and night.

One of the positive things is there was no public funding invested for the demolition of the school; it was all grant funded. The funds that were received was a Growing Communities Grant for \$1,278,000. When we received the grant in 2023, the Middle School gym roof had not collapsed. These funds were placed in a term deposit which matures on March 25, 2025 and this will cover the cost of the demolition.

Why is the cost so HIGH, a lot of the cost is because the Middle School has asbestos in it and the remediation of asbestos is very costly. It is my understanding the remainder of the school is sound and will be developed.

## The RDKB has Bear-resistant bins for sale

- Each municipality and electoral area within our Kootenay Region are able to purchase these bins. Distribution of these bins is on a first come, first serve basis.
- · Bear resistant bins are not available in the Boundary Region at this time.
- Bear resistant green bins are for organic waste collection only **NOT** for garbage collection.

## **How to Secure Your Green Bin from Bears**

- Note: No Bin is BEAR Proof it is up to you to secure your organic waste in the same responsible manner you secure your garbage.
- Store your garbage and green bins in a closed, locked garage or shed, even if empty bins will hold a residual smell.
- If a bin is stored outside, anchor it to a post using a cable so that it can't be dragged away.
- Place bins at the roadside **only on** the morning they are collected never the night before.
- Take the bin to the curb every week, even if you only have a small amount of organics in the bin.
- Put meat, bones, fish, dairy, oils, fat and fruit in your green bin never in your backyard compost.
- Minimize odours by freezing meat and other smelly food scraps, and don't put them in the green bin until collection day (use a Bag to Earth® paper bin liner NO plastics!)
- Keep bins clean.

Don't forget your blue box recyclables – they also smell delicious to bears! Rinse containers and store your blue box inside until collection day.

## How do I get a BEAR BIN?

## **RDKB Bear Bin Trade-in Program - for organics collection**

The standard 80 litre green bins distributed to residents free of charge by the RDKB are critter-resistant (to raccoons, rodents, etc.) but not bear-resistant. With this in mind, it's important that you store and manage your bin properly to not attract bears.

Interagency Grizzly Bear Committee'certified bear-resistant' green bins are available for purchase through our bear bin trade-in program, for RDKB residents who live in bear-frequented areas and are unable to keep their bins secured:

> **Step 1** - Fill out the Bear Bin Trade-In form available at **rdkb.com/greenbin** or call us and we will fill it out for you!

> **Step 2** - You will be contacted by RDKB staff to confirm bin availability and arrange for payment and a pick up date.

> **Step 3** - Bring your CLEAN 80 litre standard critter -resistant bin to the RDKB Office for trade-in at the pre-arranged date and time.

> **Step 4** - Pay and pick up your new bin. Trade-in cost is \$200 including GST.

Note: Once you purchase a Bear Bin, you keep it!

If you move to another residence, let the RDKB know, and take your Bin with you.



## WEEKLY GREEN BIN AND GARBAGE COLLECTION SCHEDULE

(Kootenay Region)





Weekly curbside green bin and garbage collection is provided by RDKB's collection partner GFL Environmental. They can answer questions about collection zones, missed pick-ups, holiday schedules and other inquiries.

Village of Montrose residents receive green bin pick-up from GFL on the day indicated. For garbage pick-up, please refer to the Village for schedule and requirements.

Set your bins (green bin and garbage) at the curb before 7:30 am on collection day.

Bring your bins in as soon as possible after collection. **DO NOT** set your bins out the night before your collection day.

**STATUTORY HOLIDAYS** - Curbside collection continues as usual on all statutory holidays except Christmas Day and New Year's Day. RDKB Landfills and Transfer Stations are **CLOSED** on statutory holidays.

### **GARBAGE TAGS**

There is no tag requirement for the green bin collection service, however all garbage bags must have a RDKB garbage tag attached and placed at the curb. Please place your garbage bag in a sturdy garbage can with secure lid. Tags are \$3 each at various locations. Please visit <a href="rdkb.com/greenbin">rdkb.com/greenbin</a> for more information.

Note: garbage bags in garbage cans must weigh less than 23kg (50 lbs) when placed at the curb.

**OOPS!** Did you receive an Oops tag on collection day? Our collection partner may leave these behind if your material is unable to be collected. The tag will indicate the issue and has contact information for you to follow up with our collection partner directly.



## Free Income Tax Service

## for GREATER TRAIL AREA RESIDENTS

This **free** service is available to low-income individuals who satisfy certain limits and restrictions. No appointments; interviews are on a first-come basis. Please arrive at least 15 minutes before the posted closing time.

## Annual income maximum guidelines are as follows:

Single person \$40,000 Two persons in family \$50,000

More than two persons \$3,000 for each additional person

Persons with investment/interest income in excess of \$1,000, capital gains/losses, partnership income, rental income, business or professional income, farming or fishing income, bankruptcy, or anyone with complex deductions may be deemed **ineligible** for this service. Also, we are unable to prepare final returns for deceased persons. Other limitations may apply.

If you have a cold, flu or other transmittable infection or disease, please wait to come until you have recovered for the protection of volunteers and other clients.

## Clinics will run:

March 3th to April 30th from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at four locations listed as follows:

**Monday** at **Waneta Mall**, where Reitman's used to be. Last interview April 21<sup>st</sup>. Last date for pickup April 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Tuesday** at **Trail United Church**, 1300 Pine Ave, Trail. Last interview April 22<sup>nd</sup>. Last date for pickup April 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Wednesday** at the **Royal Canadian Legion**, 2141 Columbia Ave, in East Trail, (next to Columbia Glass.). Enter via ramp at south end. Last interview April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Last date for pickup April 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Thursday** at **Beaver Valley Senior Citizens Manor**, 24 Laurier St., Fruitvale (across from the Fire Hall.) Last interview April 17<sup>th</sup>. Last date for pickup April 24<sup>th</sup>.

Be sure to bring all essential documents and receipts to the interview. We require a piece of government photo ID. If possible, bring your copy of the previous year's return and/or the CRA Notice of Assessment for the previous year. You will be asked to complete a questionnaire that we will use to complete your taxes.

If you are eligible to receive the GST credit or other credits, you **must** file a tax return, by May 1 to ensure timely receipt of quarterly payments which commence at the beginning of July.

Burning and Wood Waste Policy 3.06/Fire Safety and Prevention Bylaw 749, 2006

Residents are reminded that there is no open burning allowed in the Village of Fruitvale and burning any materials other than seasoned firewood (ie: plastic and plastic bags, household garbage, recyclable material, etc.) is not allowed.


The only permissible outdoor fires are small back-yard campfires (0.5 m X 0.5m in size) burning seasoned firewood only and the flames must be kept low.


## **How to Participate**
