Village of Fruitvale - Update to Residents



2025 WATER AND SEWER USER FEES

The 2025 water and sewer invoices will be sent out by March 3rd. A 5% discount will be offered for 30 days after the date of the billing. If you have not received your utility bill by March 14, please contact the Village Office a 250-367-7551 or finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca.

Payment options are as follows:

- Cheques, bank drafts and/or money orders hand delivered, mailed to or placed in the drop box at the Village Office;
- We now accept credit cards. Please note that a 3% fee will be added at the time of payment to the total paid.
- Online banking through your financial institution (Royal Bank and TD Bank excluded), payment must be received by the Village on or before the final date to be eligible for the discount so please pay 2-3 prior to the due date;
- E-transfers sent to: finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca It is very important that you reference your account number, property address and what you are paying so your payment is applied to the correct account. The Village is set up as an automatic deposit;
- The Village of Fruitvale has a monthly preauthorized prepayment plan for utilities and property taxes. This is a prepayment plan for next year's utilities and property taxes. Current charges must be paid before the prepayment plan can begin. For more information and details on the preauthorized prepayment plan, please contact Misti at the Village Office.

Want Increased Access to Our Provincial Parks this Year?

We've always cherished our local parks, but the pandemic has made us appreciate them even more! It's no surprise that our summer and fall seasons now stretch well into late October – how great is that? And no surprise that you want to spend more time outdoors! Covid encouraged many of us to head outdoors, and we embraced it wholeheartedly. We invested in kayaks, canoes, tents, trailers, bikes, boats, and plenty of sunscreen. What good medicine!

In Area A, we're lucky to have two fantastic Provincial Parks: Beaver Creek and Champion Lakes. Both are well-loved and frequently visited. Last fall, a group of local government representatives met with Ministry staff to discuss extending park opening and closing times after multiple requests from our residents. We felt positive about the meeting, only to be redirected to a park liaison we weren't familiar with. We have made NO progress with our requests to BC Parks, on your behalf.

You have told us that you are eager for the chance to get outside early and enjoy the incredible natural beauty around us. You don't want to stay cooped up indoors. We all want to recreate, stay healthy, and be active—both mentally and physically. The RDKB firmly supports your desire for increased access to our parks as residents in the Lower Mainland now enjoy.

That's why local governments, community groups, and individuals have come together to advocate for our parks. You've probably seen social media campaigns and posters around town. The Trail Wildlife Association has set up petitions at locations like Canadian Tire (Trail), Valley Firearms (Trail), the Fruitvale Co-Op, Country Roads, and IDA Pharmacy in Fruitvale. We have strong support from our MLA, Steve Morisette, but we need EVERY VOICE to join the effort.

Elections take a lot of thought and with all the crossroads and intersections along the way you hope you put the right person behind the wheel to run the bus!


More than ever with everything that is going on in our world, the thought comes to mind:

RDKB bear bin trade-in program - *organics only

These bins cost \$200, which includes GST, and they are a very robust animal resistant bin with a unique locking system. The RDKB has Bear-resistant bins for sale

- Each municipality and electoral area within our Kootenay Region are able to purchase these bins. Distribution of these bins is on a first come, first serve basis.
- · Bear resistant bins are not available in the Boundary Region at this time.
- Bear resistant green bins are for organic waste collection only **NOT** for garbage collection.

How to Secure Your Green Bin from Bears

- Note: No Bin is BEAR Proof it is up to you to secure your organic waste in the same responsible manner you secure your garbage.
- Store your garbage and green bins in a closed, locked garage or shed, even if empty bins will hold a residual smell.
- If a bin is stored outside, anchor it to a post using a cable so that it can't be dragged away.
- Place bins at the roadside **only on** the morning they are collected never the night before.
- Take the bin to the curb every week, even if you only have a small amount of organics in the bin.
- Put meat, bones, fish, dairy, oils, fat and fruit in your green bin never in your backyard compost.
- Minimize odours by freezing meat and other smelly food scraps, and don't put them in the green bin until collection day (use a Bag to Earth® paper bin liner NO plastics!)
- Keep bins clean.

Don't forget your blue box recyclables – they also smell delicious to bears! Rinse containers and store your blue box inside until collection day.

How do I get a BEAR BIN?

RDKB Bear Bin Trade-in Program - for organics collection

The standard 80 litre green bins distributed to residents free of charge by the RDKB are critter-resistant (to raccoons, rodents, etc.) but not bear-resistant. With this in mind, it's important that you store and manage your bin properly to not attract bears.

Interagency Grizzly Bear Committee'certified bear-resistant' green bins are available for purchase through our bear bin trade-in program, for RDKB residents who live in bear-frequented areas and are unable to keep their bins secured:

> **Step 1** - Fill out the Bear Bin Trade-In form available at **rdkb.com/greenbin** or call us and we will fill it out for you!

> **Step 2** - You will be contacted by RDKB staff to confirm bin availability and arrange for payment and a pick up date.

> **Step 3** - Bring your CLEAN 80 litre standard critter -resistant bin to the RDKB Office for trade-in at the pre-arranged date and time.

> **Step 4** - Pay and pick up your new bin. Trade-in cost is \$200 including GST.

Note: Once you purchase a Bear Bin, you keep it!

If you move to another residence, let the RDKB know, and take your Bin with you.



FRUITVALE AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT FAQ January 2025

What is the Fruitvale Affordable Housing Project?

The Lower Columbia Affordable Housing Society (LCAHS), Village of Fruitvale, BC Housing, and Columbia Basin Trust have partnered to build a 31-unit affordable rental housing building on a portion of the former middle school site at 96 Deadmarsh Avenue. The three-storey building will be adjacent to the new childcare centre being developed by the Village. LCAHS is the non-profit developer, owner, and future operator of the building. The Village is contributing the land in the form of a long-term lease with LCAHS.

What is the name of the building?

The name of the building is Blizzard Mountain Place. Suggestions were put forward by the public and the final name was chosen by the LCAHS and the Village of Fruitvale Council.

What are the funding sources for the project?

The cost of developing these new homes is expected to reach approximately \$17 million. Funding partners include BC Housing, Columbia Basin Trust, Teck Metals Ltd., and Kootenay Savings Credit Union. The project team is working with the BC Housing and Canada Mortgage and Housing Commission to access mortgage financing for the balance of the project cost.

Why is the Village of Fruitvale involved?

As the owner of close to 10 acres of land surrounding the former middle school, the Village is keen to develop this piece of land close to services and Fruitvale's downtown for housing and other community needs. To that end, the Village published a Master Plan in 2020 for the site following consultation with the community. The Master Plan provides a three-phase roadmap for development of the land. The first phase includes development of affordable rental housing, a childcare centre, and private market housing. The Village of Fruitvale does not have a role in the selection of tenants or the operations of the building. Tenant selection will be led by the LCAHS.

Who would live here?

The target populations for the affordable rental housing are low-to-moderate income families, seniors, and adults living with developmental disabilities. This intergenerational and mixed income approach is designed to encourage a sense of community inclusion. The building will include a play area for children, bike storage, electrical vehicle charging stations, interior and exterior social spaces, and gardening space for those interested in growing a few vegetables.



What will be the criteria used to qualify for housing?

Applicants will need to register with the <u>Housing Registry</u> and qualify based on income and asset limits set by BC Housing as part of the Community Housing Fund criteria.

What are the rental rates?

The project is designed to provide homes for <u>low-to-moderate income</u> households with limited assets (apart from registered retirement, education, and disability plan savings). The funding from BC Housing requires rent for 20% of the units be deeply subsidized; 50% will be calculated based on 30% of household income and 30% will be rented at market rental rates.

When will the building be ready for people to move in?

The project officially broke ground in November 2023, with completion and occupancy in late 2025.

How will construction affect the local neighbourhood and immediate neighbours?

The building site is bordered by Mazzochi Park, Columbia Gardens Road, and the new childcare centre. We do not anticipate significant impact on existing houses adjacent to the larger 10-acre "middle school" site. Access to the building site will be from Columbia Gardens Road along a new road named Deadmarsh Avenue. The contractor, North Mountain Construction, will closely manage construction related traffic to and from the site, and work in close relationship with the Village to mitigate impacts on the community. Construction activity, hours, and noise will be subject to restrictions set by the Village.

Is the building site a safe location for rental housing?

Yes. Environmental studies were completed for the site and no issues of concern were identified. The Human Health and Ecological Risk Assessment completed for the site also confirmed its safety for residential development.

Who and how tenants be selected for the building?

The LCAHS is responsible for selecting tenants from applications submitted using BC Housing's on-line Housing Registry: housingapplication.bchousing.org. LCAHS staff will assist anyone who needs help with this on-line application process.

When will people be able to apply for housing at the Fruitvale affordable housing project?

The Housing Registry application process will open in spring 2025 with review of the applications beginning a few months later. Opening of the online application will be announced on the LCAHS website and the Village of Fruitvale's social media pages.

How do I contact LCAHS with additional questions?








NON-WORKING STREETLIGHTS

Free Income Tax Service

for GREATER TRAIL AREA RESIDENTS

This **free** service is available to low-income individuals who satisfy certain limits and restrictions. No appointments; interviews are on a first-come basis. Please arrive at least 15 minutes before the posted closing time.

Annual income maximum guidelines are as follows:

Single person \$40,000 Two persons in family \$50,000

More than two persons \$3,000 for each additional person

Persons with investment/interest income in excess of \$1,000, capital gains/losses, partnership income, rental income, business or professional income, farming or fishing income, bankruptcy, or anyone with complex deductions may be deemed **ineligible** for this service. Also, we are unable to prepare final returns for deceased persons. Other limitations may apply.

If you have a cold, flu or other transmittable infection or disease, please wait to come until you have recovered for the protection of volunteers and other clients.

Clinics will run:

March 3th to April 30th from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at four locations listed as follows:

Monday at **Waneta Mall**, where Reitman's used to be. Last interview April 21st. Last date for pickup April 28th.

Tuesday at **Trail United Church**, 1300 Pine Ave, Trail. Last interview April 22nd. Last date for pickup April 29th.

Wednesday at the **Royal Canadian Legion**, 2141 Columbia Ave, in East Trail, (next to Columbia Glass.). Enter via ramp at south end. Last interview April 23rd. Last date for pickup April 30th.

Thursday at **Beaver Valley Senior Citizens Manor**, 24 Laurier St., Fruitvale (across from the Fire Hall.) Last interview April 17th. Last date for pickup April 24th.

Be sure to bring all essential documents and receipts to the interview. We require a piece of government photo ID. If possible, bring your copy of the previous year's return and/or the CRA Notice of Assessment for the previous year. You will be asked to complete a questionnaire that we will use to complete your taxes.

If you are eligible to receive the GST credit or other credits, you **must** file a tax return, by May 1 to ensure timely receipt of quarterly payments which commence at the beginning of July.
