Mayor Wes Startup Village of Fruitvale



Council has re-focused its efforts on developing the green space behind the Fruitvale Memorial Hall. Under the steady hand of Councillor Halifax the conceptual plans are being developed that will make this area a great community gathering spot.

2025 OUTSTANDING UTILITIES & TAXES



Reminder to Montrose Residents: All outstanding water and sewer utilities are due on December 31st, 2025. On January 1, 2026, unpaid utilities are transferred to taxes in arrears and will be subject to interest charges. Any unpaid current taxes or unclaimed Home Owners Grants will be transferred to taxes in arrears on January 1, 2026, if not paid or claimed by December 31, 2025. If you have any questions regarding 2025 utilities or taxes, please contact the Village Office.





THE VILLAGE OF FRUITVALE REMINDER NOTICES

OUTSTANDING PROPERTY TAXES AND UTILITIES

All outstanding 2025 property taxes and utilities are due by December 31, 2025. Outstanding taxes and utilities as of January 1, 2026, will be transferred to property taxes in arrears and accrue daily interest.

With the Village Office being closed the last week of December, please choose one of the options below to make your payment:

E-transfer to finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca in the memo box make sure to reference your roll number or street address and what the payment is for.

Through on-line banking for taxes and utilities (allow 3 business days for payment to reach the office).

Drop your payment in the drop box at the front entrance of the Village Office.

To avoid interest, all payments must reach the Village Office by December 31, 2025, including those sent by mail and made through online banking.



2026 DOG TAGS (licenses)



Just a reminder to dog owners - all dogs in the Village and RDKB are required to be licensed. A dog tag (license) on your dog will ensure that it is returned to you if it is found out of your yard. It's a small price to pay for the safe return of your family pet. Village residents who purchased dog tags in 2025, please note: you will be receiving an invoice for the 2026 dog tag/license fee, but you will not be receiving a new tag, unless your dog has lost its tag. If there are any changes to the information on your invoice, please contact the office so we can update our files. Remember that it is a contravention of the Animal Responsibility Bylaw No. 922, 2025 to allow your dogs to run free and bark continually. Dogs at large run the risk of being hit by a vehicle or taken by a wild animal. For the safety, peace, and comfort of your neighbours, ensure your dog(s) are secure in your house or yard and do not let them bark continually at all hours of the day and night.

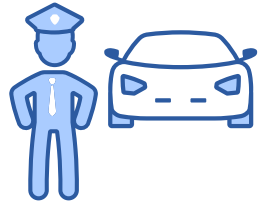
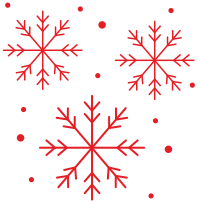
BOULEVARD PARKING

The Village of Fruitvale's Bylaw Officer will be patrolling the Village and enforcing our bylaws.



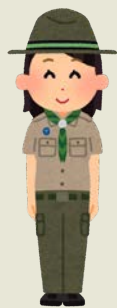
CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

We wish you a Merry Christmas and a joyous season.



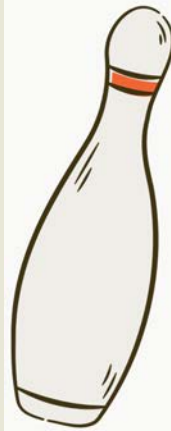

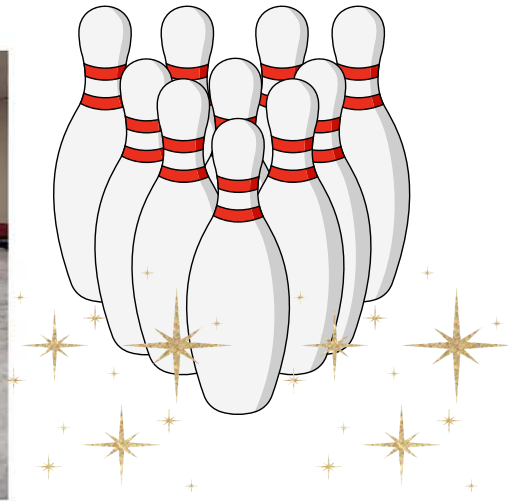


It has been an exciting summer for the Beaver Valley Bowling Club!
