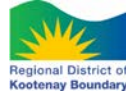

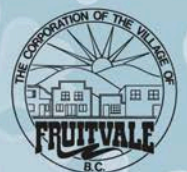
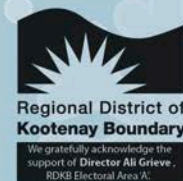

Greetings, and Happy New Year to All!

As we move into another important year for our communities, there is much to look forward to. Along with keeping our existing services running smoothly and ensuring that our Regional District facilities remain well maintained, we have a number of exciting projects underway.

One highlight early this year will be planning for the ribbon-cutting of the new provincially funded yurt at Beaver Valley Family Park. This unique addition will offer new opportunities for outdoor recreation and community use. In addition, Area A has partnered with the Village of Fruitvale to begin developing the proposed green space behind Memorial Hall. This collaborative project will help enhance our shared public spaces and create a welcoming area for community activities.

Official Community Plan (OCP) Update

Another significant development is the forthcoming review and update of our Area A Official Community Plan (OCP). Provincial legislation describes an OCP as “a general statement of the broad objectives and policies of the local government respecting the form and character of existing and proposed land use and servicing requirements in the area covered by the plan.”

In simpler terms, the OCP outlines the long-term vision for how our community will grow and evolve—addressing land use, housing, infrastructure, environmental protection, public facilities, and community services.

I was fortunate to participate in the last OCP review and am very familiar with the process. With many years of involvement in major planning efforts, I look forward to helping guide the next steps over the coming years. This update will involve extensive public engagement, including public meetings, online surveys, and mail-out opportunities through the RDKB Join the Conversation platform.

Please watch for your chance to participate—your input will be essential to shaping our future.

BC Winter Games– 2026

As many of you know, the figure skating events of the 2026 BC Winter Games will be held at the Beaver Valley Arena from February 25 to March 1, 2026. Fruitvale will welcome young athletes from across the province, and we can expect some truly exceptional performances.

BOULEVARD PARKING

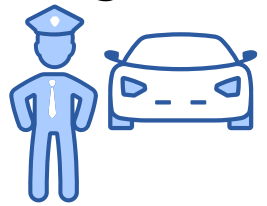
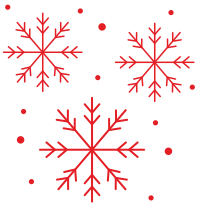
Residents are reminded that during the winter months snow is plowed onto the Village boulevard.

The Village of Fruitvale's Bylaw Officer will be patrolling the Village and enforcing our bylaws.



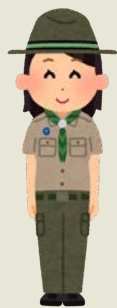
CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

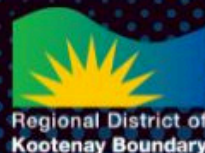

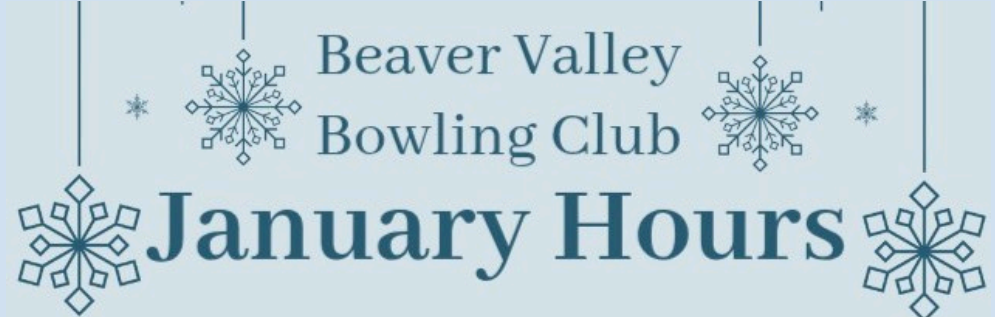
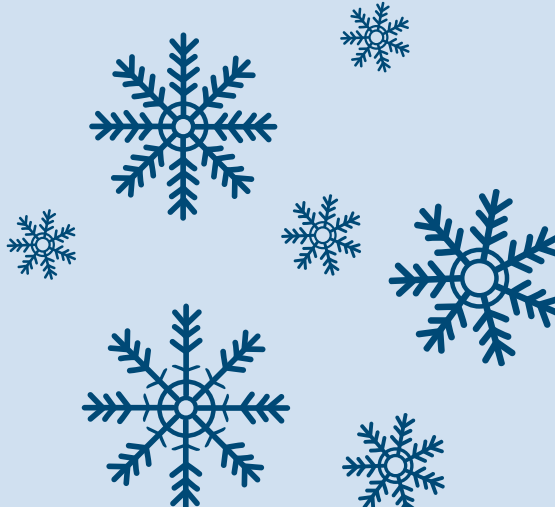
