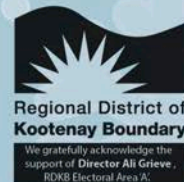

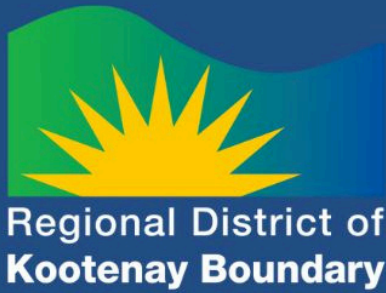

BC Winter Games – 2026

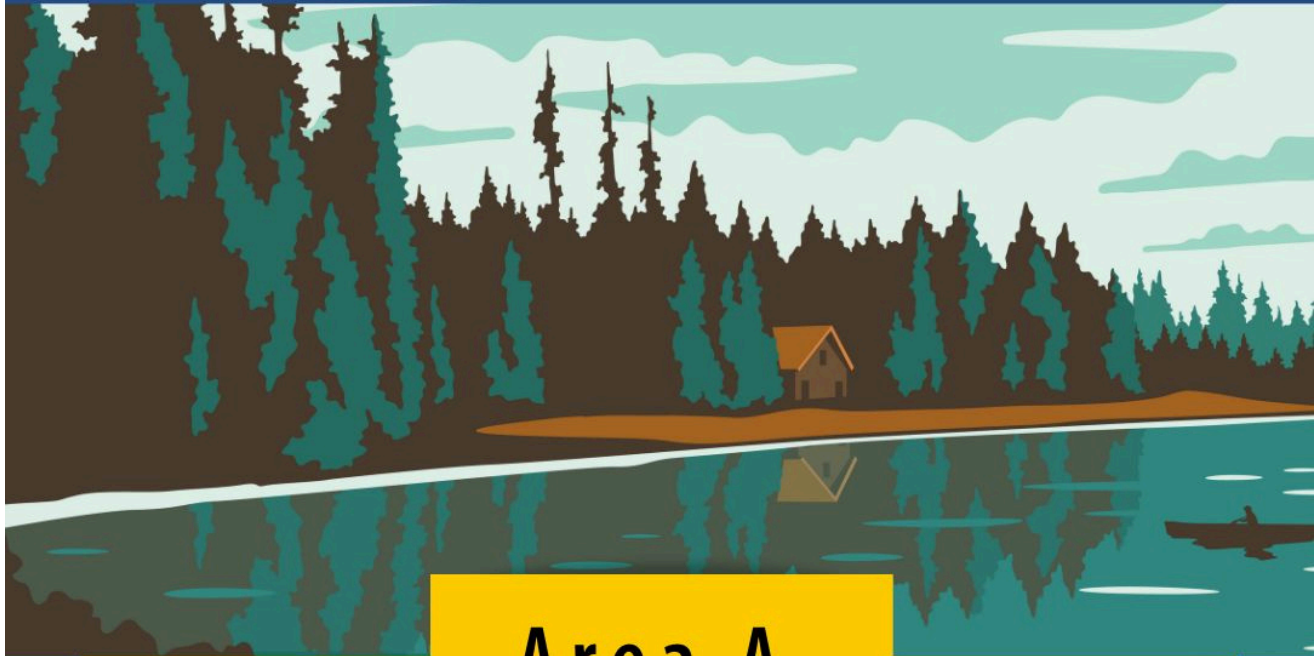
As many of you know, the figure skating events of the 2026 BC Winter Games will take place at the Beaver Valley Arena from February 25 to March 1, 2026.

Mayor Wes Startup Village of Fruitvale



January 2026 has been one of the driest Januarys in memory and we didn't see much snow in December either. Although high elevation snowpacks are on track at 117% of normal, snow water equivalent measurements are indicating 30-40% of normal for the West Kootenay. The low snow water equivalent measurements along with very low snow pack levels at mid-elevations are concerning from a drinking water perspective as our potable water system relies on melt water to replenish both our watershed and the local aquifer for our two wells. I'm hoping for more snow events in the next few months that will build up our water reserve. On the bright side the Village is seeing reduced costs for snow removal and sanding.

Residents continue to report that vehicle traffic is exceeding set speed limits within the Village. This is concerning especially in the areas of playgrounds, schools, residential side streets, and our childcare facilities. Please slow down adhere to the speed limits. If you observe speeding please report this to the RCMP.

Teck Resources has reached out to let the Village know that they have opened their Community Investment funding program for qualifying groups. Societies and nonprofit organizations could potentially benefit from funding and you can check out the application process on the Teck webpage or by following this link:

This is a great step forward in expanding our housing stock and utilizing our middle-school site. Welcome to all our new Fruitvale residents! I hope your stay is long and you have a chance to take advantage of all the Village has to offer. Council continues to work towards further development of the remaining middle-school site both short-term and long-term.
