Area A Official Community Plan (OPC) Review

The review of the Area A Official Community Plan (OCP) is now underway, with a dedicated group of residents and community organizations beginning this important work. Although still in the early stages, this process will soon expand to include broader public engagement. This review will help shape the future of Area A for the next 10-20 years. It is critical that community members take part in upcoming surveys and public meetings to ensure your voices are heard and your priorities are reflected.

Just as important is maintaining strong, consistent leadership throughout this multi-year process. Seeing the OCP review through from start to finish requires continuity, accountability, and a clear understanding of the work already underway. I am committed to completing this process alongside the community while ensuring your input is carried forward into the final plan. Please watch closely for engagement opportunities and make every effort to be involved.

2026 Budgets

I say this every year, but the budget approval process truly becomes more challenging each time. With ongoing provincial downloading, along with both federal and provincial governments reducing funding across a range of programs, more community groups are looking to local governments to help fill the gaps.

Unfortunately, we do not have surplus reserves of funding waiting to be allocated. The RDKB can only levy taxes for services that are formally established and delivered within our communities. We are not permitted to raise taxes to respond to unexpected requests, even when the cause is a worthy one.

Below, I've included a table outlining the percentage increases for Regional District services only. These figures may vary slightly, as my newsletter was submitted just prior to final budget adoption.

Please also note the increase in assessed values for Area A, as this helps offset the amount each of us will pay in property taxes. For context, I have included all Regional District communities for comparison.

As always, I appreciate your interest and engagement in the budget process.

What is the public hearing about?

The public hearing is for a site-specific amendment to the Area A Official Community Plan and Area A Zoning Bylaw for the subject property at 3340 Highway 3B, in Electoral Area A.

What is the purpose of Bylaw No. 1927 and Bylaw No. 1928?

The intent of the bylaws is to facilitate subdivision by reducing the minimum parcel size for a relative from a minimum parcel size of 10ha to 2ha, to create one 2ha parcel.

Proposed Bylaw 1927 would amend Electoral Area A Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 1410, by amending the text to specify that the minimum parcel size for a lot to be considered for residence of a relative under

Section 514 of the *Local Government Act* may be 2 ha for the subject parcel.

Proposed Bylaw 1928 would amend Electoral Area A Zoning Bylaw No. 1460 by adding an exception for the subject parcel to allow a minimum parcel size of 2ha, provided that a Section 219 Covenant is registered on both the parcel created under this section and the remaining portion of the parent parcel stating that Section 514 of the *Local Government Act* cannot be used for any future subdivision of those parcels.

Who will be at the Public Hearing? Director Ali Grieve has been delegated by the RDKB Board of Directors to preside over the Public Hearing. RDKB Planning and Development staff will also be in attendance.

Council met twice in March where the main theme and topic of discussion is budget and taxes. These discussions have been quite engaging as we work through all the line items on the budget and make some decisions on the priorities for next year. We are very-very close to finalizing the numbers and we look forward to sharing the plan with residents on April 21st at the Fruitvale Memorial Centre.

We continue to work towards a resolution with Village employees regarding the Collective Agreement. Council and prefers to discuss the details of the contract directly with our Team and Union.

BURNING



The Village Office continues to receive complaints about the smell and the smoke coming from illegal open burning fires and wood stove/fireplace fires.



Residents are reminded that there is NO OPEN BURNING allowed in the Village of Fruitvale and burning any materials other than seasoned firewood (i.e.: plastic and plastic bags, household garbage, recyclable material, etc.) IS NOT allowed.

The only permissible outdoor fires are small back-yard campfires (0.5 m X 0.5m in size) and ONLY seasoned firewood is to be burned. Flames are to be kept low.

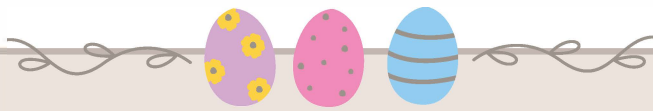
All paper, cardboard and other recyclable products must be recycled appropriately.

LANEWAY MAINTENANCE

Residents are reminded that under Bylaw 779, boulevards and laneways must be kept clear of weeds, leaves, yard and garden waste, rubbish, and discarded materials.

The Bylaw Officer will be patrolling laneways this spring to ensure compliance with the bylaw. Please ensure that:

- Landscaping (trees, shrubs, hedges, etc.) is properly maintained and not encroaching into the roadway or laneway
- Vegetation cuttings, leaves, yard waste, rubbish, discarded materials, or any liquid or solid waste are not left on public property
- Items such as rocks, gravel, bricks, or other materials are not placed on the boulevard adjacent to a roadway, curb, or sidewalk

Keeping laneways clear helps maintain safe access for residents, emergency vehicles, and municipal services.

LEAVES AND BRANCHES PICKUP

Spring curbside pickup for Montrose Residents is scheduled for April 23rd. Leaves must be in brown compostable paper bags (no plastic) or reusable bins under 40 lbs. Branches must be bundled with cotton or fiber-based string—no plastic or nylon. All materials must be at your regular garbage pickup spot by 7:00 AM.

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping has been tentatively scheduled for April 13 – 14. A reminder that the sweeper is unable to pick up piles of gravel. If you are going to place gravel on the street, have it in a long, thin row.

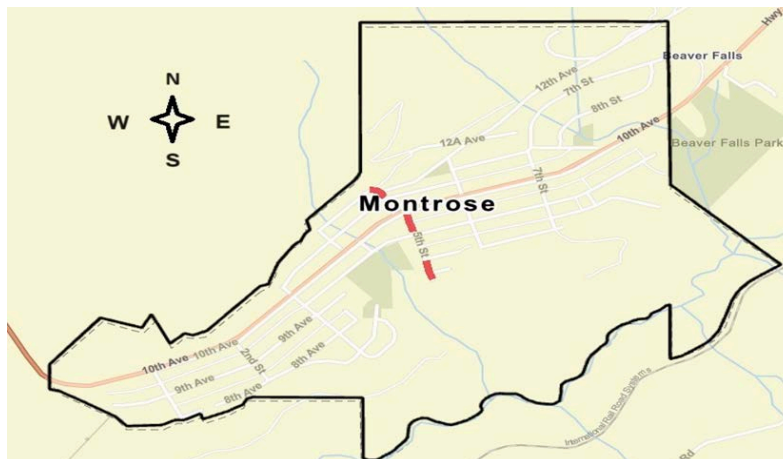

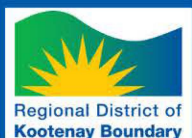

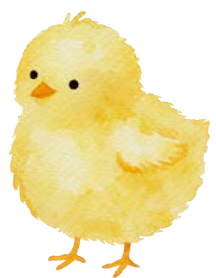
