### Addressing Resident Concerns

As your elected representative, I am always happy to hear from residents. While the Regional District is not responsible for road safety and maintenance, we regularly receive feedback about safety concerns—particularly from those who travel the Bombi Highway for school, work, or recreation. In response, we arranged a meeting with the Ministry of Transportation to share these concerns directly. Mayor Startup and I meet regularly with the Ministry of Transportation and Yellowhead Road & Bridge crews. Recently, we had the opportunity to drive the Bombi Highway with Ryan, a traffic engineer assigned to review the corridor and hear our concerns firsthand. Ryan provided valuable insight into current engineering standards and explained how decisions are made across the provincial highway network to ensure consistency in traffic control measures. Below is a summary of key concerns raised by residents, along with potential actions discussed during our review.

### Engineering Consideration of the Bombi Corridor

The Bombi Highway, constructed in the 1960s, provides a direct route between Salmo, Fruitvale, and Castlegar. The summit reaches an elevation of 1,215 metres, with grades of approximately 6%, which are typical for mountain highways in the region. Due to its elevation and terrain, weather and road conditions can change quickly. Drivers are encouraged to adjust their speed and remain alert. To reinforce this, two large warning signs were recently installed at the start of the pass in 2025 to highlight the challenges of mountain driving.

### Guardrails

There are currently 4.9 km of concrete roadside barriers along the Bombi Highway. Guardrail placement is determined through engineering reviews that assess both the likelihood and severity of potential incidents. Key factors include:

- The location of hazards: for westbound traffic, the primary risk is on the ditch side; for eastbound traffic, it is on the fill (downhill) side. This is why most guardrails are on the eastbound lane.
- Downhill sections carry greater risk than uphill sections, resulting in more barriers on descending portions of the highway.
- Guardrails are generally not installed on straight sections or inside curves, where the risk of vehicles leaving the roadway is lower.
- On straight sections and inside curves, guardrails can contribute to water pooling and icing, as the road surface slopes toward the barrier. On outside curves, water drains away more effectively.

Ryan completed a review of the corridor and identified the following:

- Two eastbound sections climbing out of Castlegar meet the criteria for additional guardrails.
- These sections will be submitted to the provincial guardrail program and added to the priority list for funding. Timelines for installation are not yet confirmed.
- In the interim, delineators will be installed to help guide drivers safely through these areas.
- Reflectors will also be added to existing guardrails along the corridor to improve visibility.

### Signage

The review identified several curves where updated signage could improve warnings and better align with current standards. Improvements in these areas are being considered.

We are grateful for the strong working relationship we have built with the Ministry of Transportation. We appreciate Ryan taking the time to meet with us, listen to residents' concerns, and offer practical solutions. The experience was both informative and valuable for Mayor Startup and me.

**This month will be a busy time for the Village Council and Staff as we undertake a re-vamp of our Official Community Plan (OCP) and update our Zoning Bylaw. The intent here is to bring our very dated (2011) OCP up to date, ensure we are aligned with the prevailing Provincial legislation, and pull together all the plans and reports we've completed since 2011 into a comprehensive document that is easy to understand. We will also ensure that our Zoning Bylaw reflects and supports the OCP. The project is slated to be completed January 2027.**

**It goes without saying that your input will be an invaluable part of this project. There will be other public engagement opportunities such as pop-ups and sessions at the Community Hall.**

**Work has started on the waterline upgrade along Green Road. This line will replace a very old (original) piece of pipe and will be increased in size. This work is long overdue and will result in better flow and a reduced risk of failure. Contractors will be busy along this stretch and traffic flow will be affected.**

**Longer days and sunshine make June a great time for outdoor activities, I hope everyone can take full advantage of what our beautiful area has to offer!**

#### 2026 PROPERTY TAX NOTICES & BC HOMEOWNER GRANT

- Property tax notices **will be mailed out at the end of May** and are due on **Thursday, July 2, 2026**.
- A 10% penalty will be applied to all current taxes that are **not paid by July 2, 2026**.
- **Homeowner Grants** must be submitted to the province by **Thursday, July 2, 2026**. A 10% penalty is applied to late submissions. 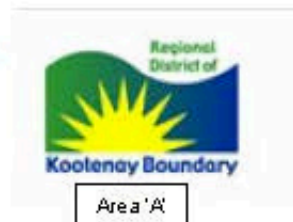

## WATER CONSERVATION REGULATIONS

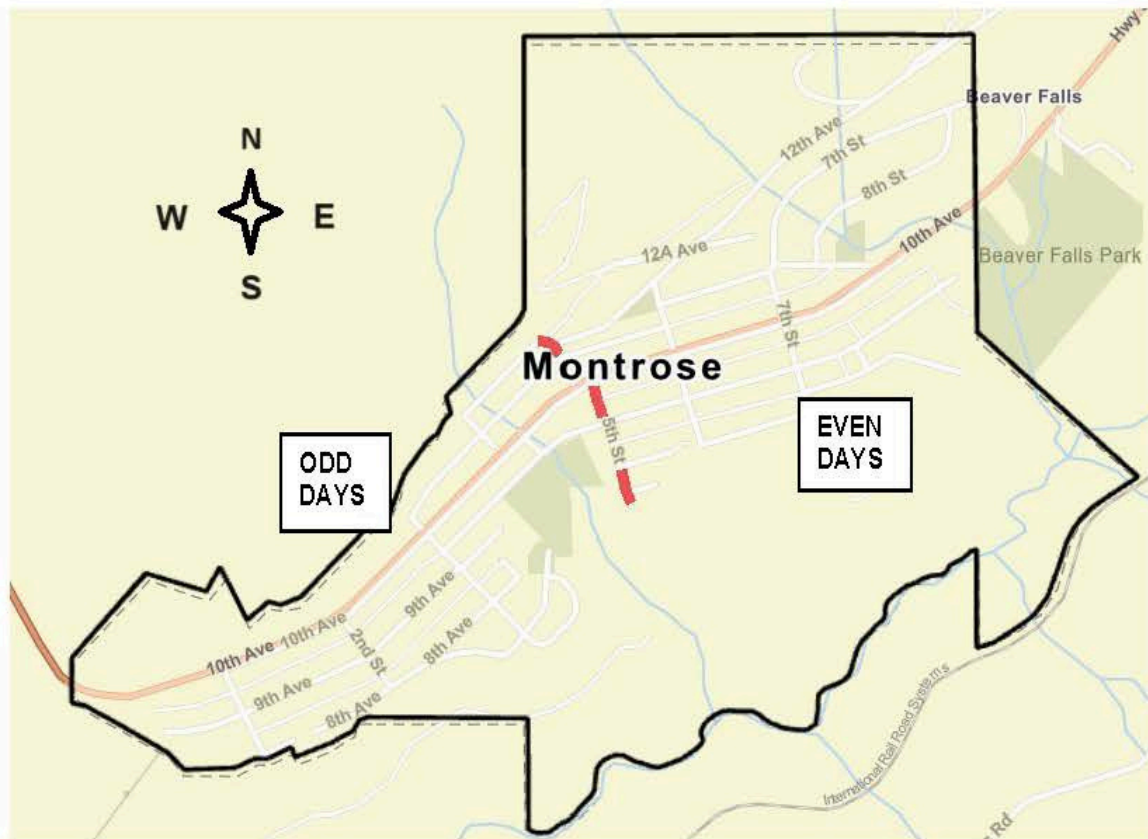
Our water system is currently operating at maximum capacity. To ensure a safe and reliable supply for all residents, water use regulations will be strictly enforced.

Bylaw officer will be monitoring compliance and may issue fines to anyone watering outside of permitted times or in violation of current restrictions. We appreciate your cooperation in helping conserve water during this time.

As per Bylaw #702 "Water Conservation and Staging Restrictions Regulations"

- Houses east of 5<sup>th</sup> Street water on **even numbered days - 6am-8am & 6pm-8pm**
- Houses west of 5<sup>th</sup> Street water on **odd numbered days - 6am-8am & 6pm-8pm**
- Underground sprinklers between 12:00 am and 4:00 am on permitted days
- Watering with sprayer hoes and other sprinklers between 6:00 am and 8:00 am and 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm on permitted days
- **NO SPRINKLING ON THE 31ST OF ANY MONTH**

If Village Council needs to enact further regulations within Bylaw #702 "Water Conservation and Staging Restrictions Regulations", residents will be advised.



# Property Tax



## USING E-TRANSFER TO MAKE PAYMENTS TO THE VILLAGE OF FRUITVALE

When paying by E-transfer, it is **imperative** that you indicate in the memo section what you are paying, the invoice number, your roll/account/folio number listed on your invoice or your street address, so that your payment can be applied to the correct account.

## 2026 VILLAGE OF FRUITVALE PROPERTY TAXES

The 2026 property tax notices will be mailed to homeowners mid May and are due Thursday July 2, 2026, to avoid a 10% penalty. (The Village Office will be closed Wednesday, July 1). If you do not receive your tax notice by June 9, please contact the Village Office, 250-367-7551.

### To apply for your Home Owner Grant

When you receive your tax notice, please visit the provincial website at [www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant](http://www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant) to apply online or call toll free to 1-888-355-2700 to speak with an agent. **Home Owner Grants must be applied for every year.**

## HOW TO PAY YOUR ANNUAL PROPERTY TAXES:

- Cash, Cheque, money order, bank draft, credit card: Attach your cheque to the bottom tear-off portion of your tax notice and place in our mail slot to the lower left of the front door or mail it through Canada Post. We no longer accept post-dated cheques. Postmarks are not accepted. There is a 3% charge on the use of credit cards.
- Online banking: This is available with the Credit Union, Scotiabank, CIBC and BMO ONLY. Find us under "Fruitvale, Village – Property Tax". Depending on the requirements of your financial institution, use at least the last 6 digits of your roll number without the 521 and the decimal point. For example, Roll No. 521 00123.456 would be 123456. If more digits are required, use more zeros. For example, Roll No. 521 00123.456 would be 00000123456.
- E-Transfer: Send your payment to [finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca](mailto:finance@village.fruitvale.bc.ca). We are set up for auto deposit; no password is required. You must write your roll number in the messages to ensure the payment is applied to the correct account. We are not responsible for payments made to the wrong account if this is missed.

Property Taxes are due Thursday July 2, 2026. Be sure to apply for your home owner grant, if applicable, at [www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant](http://www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant) or phone 1-888-355-2700 before July 2, 2026 to avoid a 10% penalty on your unapplied for home owner grant.

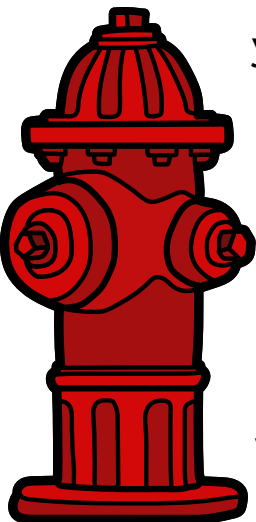


BEAVER VALLEY WATER SERVICE  
HYDRANT MAINTENANCE

Water users on the Beaver Valley Water Service are advised that the Water Department will be maintaining and flushing fire hydrants throughout the month of June.

This program is performed as part of a scheduled preventative maintenance program.

As hydrants are flushed, users may experience a temporary reduction in water pressure. You may also see some colour and/or notice a slight change in the taste and odour of your water. These conditions are normal during flushing activities and are only temporary. If you experience any of these changes or if you see some cloudiness or rust colour in your water, we recommend you refrain from washing your laundry and run the water in your home until the water runs clear.

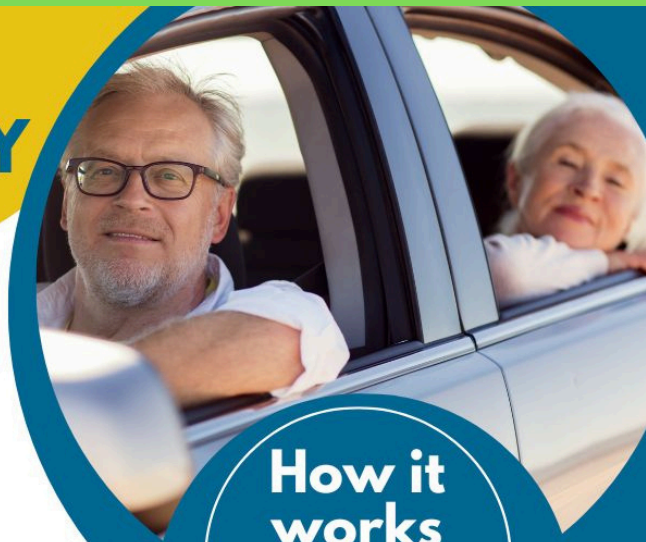

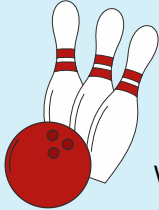

**UNSIGHTLY PREMISES:**

The Village of Fruitvale would like to remind residents that complaints have been received regarding properties that are in contravention of the Property Standards Bylaw No. 845, 2014.

Concerns include the accumulation of debris such as construction materials, garbage, tree clippings and yard waste, as well as unmaintained lawns and the growth of noxious weeds.

In addition to being unsightly and in violation of Village bylaws, the accumulation of these materials may create a fire hazard for both property owners and neighbouring residents.

Property owners are asked to remove debris and maintain their properties in accordance with the required standards.

The Bylaw Enforcement Officer will begin issuing warning notices to properties with excessive debris, noxious weeds, or poorly maintained yards.

Please take the necessary steps to clean up and maintain your property.

Failure to comply may result in enforcement action by the Village, including cleanup at the property owner's expense.
